

Trucksville Fire Company Inspects Elementary School

Fire drills and building inspections were made recently of Westmoreland and Trucksville Elementary Schools by a seven-man committee of Trucksville Volunteer Fire Company.

Under the signature of Fire Chief Robert Chamberlain, a number of recommendations were made to Dallas School District administration to facilitate safety measures.

James O. Brokenshire, assistant to the superintendent, re-

ported that most recommendations by the fire company have been remedied or are being remedied.

"Our deepest concern is for the safety of the children," he stated.

For Westmoreland School, recommendations were: (1) receptacles should be converted to three prong receptacle, as all adaptors used are not being grounded; (2) check, readjust and install door checks where

needed; (3) advise teachers and custodians that pressurized cans and other combustible materials should be kept in metal containers and out of reach of children; (4) a complete check of electrical circuits throughout the building.

The inspection team made the following recommendations on the fire drill procedure used at Trucksville School: (1) instead of having the upper floor students exit from the building and proceed toward the front of the building, the upper west rooms proceed to the northerly side of building and upper floor east rooms exit to east side of school grounds in order to remove students from the street side and sidewalk.

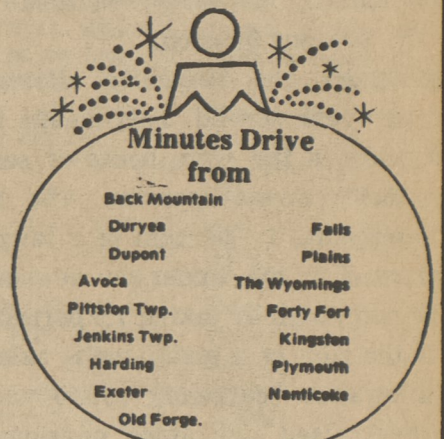
