

Penn State to Exhibit Art by Faculty Members

An art exhibit at the Wilkes-Barre Campus of The Pennsylvania State University Nov. 22 through Dec. 3 has been announced by George W. Bierly, campus director. The exhibit is one in a series of cultural events planned by the university for both students and the general public.

The exhibit will feature paintings of Wirth McCoy, professor of art, and Eleanor Zyglar, associate professor of art, both Penn State faculty members.

Mr. McCoy is a graduate of The University of Minnesota, University of Iowa and Academie de la Grande Chaumiere in Paris. He has also studied at the California School of Fine Arts in San Francisco, and with painters Yasuo Kuniyoshi, Mark Rothko and others.

Prior to his position with Penn State, Mr. McCoy taught for five years at Oregon State University and then, for 11 years was artist in residence and director of the Washington State University Art Center in Spokane. He has been head of

the Department of Art at Penn State for the past seven years.

His exhibit will represent the various directions he has pursued in the last 10 years including both pictorial and abstract paintings. His most recent work represents his sabbatical leave in Guatemala and Mexico where he painted the picturesque village of San Miguel d'Allende. A second recent work, "A Spot of Blue", completely abstract in nature, will also be exhibited.

Miss Zyglar, a member of the faculty at Penn State, University Park, has been instrumental in developing community art classes and Art Alliance of Central Pennsylvania. She studied art at Carnegie Mellon University, Mills College, Yale University, and Brandeis. She also studied with Mr. Kuniyoshi at Ohio University, Hans Hoffman, Provincetown, and at the Institute de Belles Artes, San Miguel, Mexico.

Miss Zyglar believes artistic endeavor must be a two way communication encompassing the receptiveness of the artist's

work as it speaks to his contemporaries. The true essence of art, she said, is that it delights the eye, instructs the mind and moves the human spirit.

The painter describes her work as being lyrical, poetic, and close to nature. Her paintings make use of the organic strength in the structure and color of nature's forms. All of her paintings have been done recently. Among them are "Sun and Shadow," "The Lost Bridge," and "Snowbound."

There is no charge for admission and persons interested in oil paintings are encouraged to attend the exhibit. It will be open to the public daily from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m.

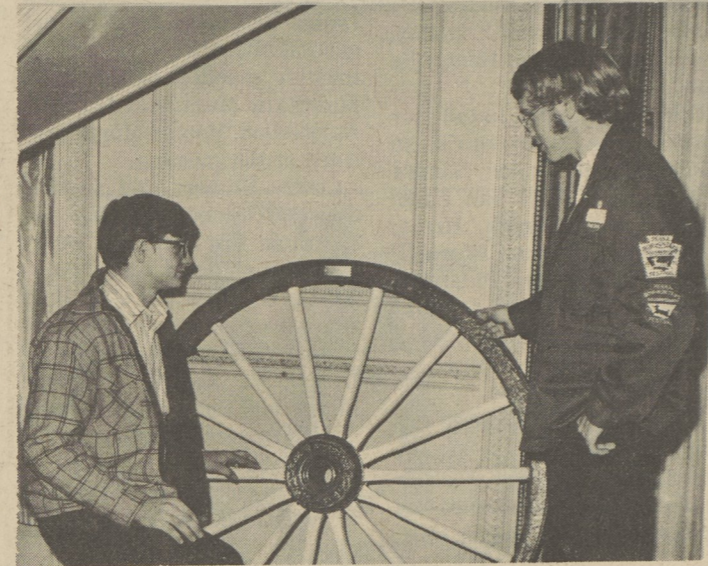

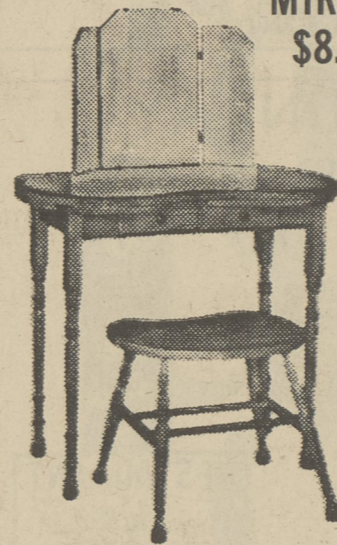
