The Sneak-a-Snak's metal canopy came clattering down under the weight of 30-plus inches of accumulated snow Thursday afternoon.

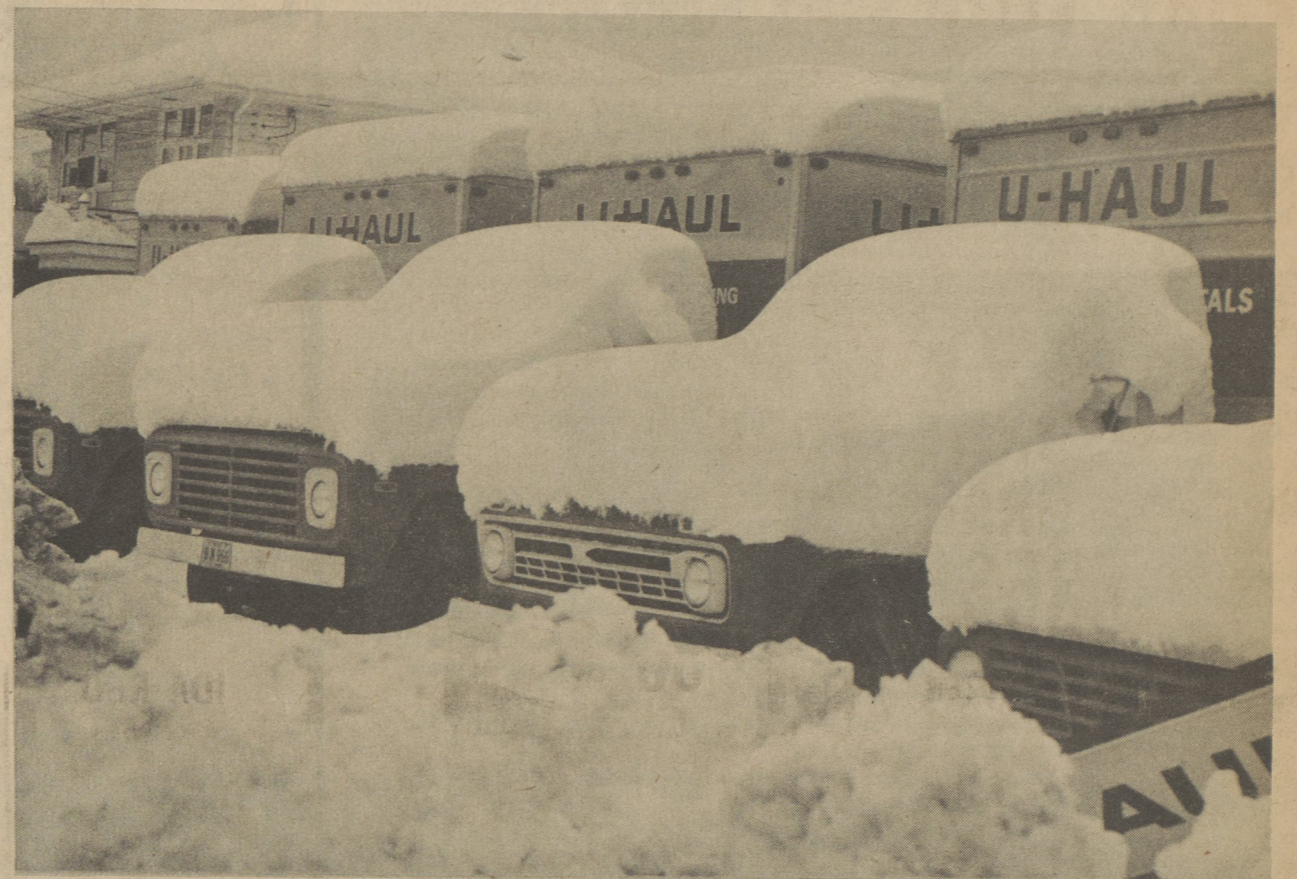
