schools are entitled to a refund of up to \$75 for grade school children and \$150 for high school students.

To qualify for reimbursement, parents will have to complete tuition payments by May 1972, forward a cancelled check or receipted bill accompanied by a government form signed by the school principal verifying that their child attended non-public school for the past year. It is anticipated that refunds will start September 1972.

Apprehension over tuition costs was somewhat dispelled by Father Jordan's statement that no child will be turned away from parochial school because of his parents' inability to meet this additional financial burden.

It was noted that this new cost is in addition to any previous or existing educational fees.

However, if in the commission's opinion there is any question about lawfulness or reasonableness of rates, it can and does suspend them for a total period of nine months. An investigation then is held to determine whether the rates are just and reasonable.

PUC literature states that a utility must be allowed for its service a fair return on the fair value of its property used and useful in the public service.

As of 1960, the prescribed fair rate of return for some 24 electric companies in the state was 5.9 percent. In 1965, the fair rate of return for investor-

owned utilities was 6.10 percent.

The statutory powers of the commission, which has regulated in the Commonwealth since 1914, are exercised through the adoption of orders after hearing. Such proceedings may be initiated on application, on complaint, or on the commission's own motion.

Proceedings directed to adequacy of service or reasonableness of rates are usually initiated on complaint. Individual consumers, groups of citizens or representatives of municipalities may bring actions before the commission.
