

93 Dallas Students Cited For NEDT Performance

John F. Rosser, principal of the Dallas Junior High School, has announced that 93 junior high students will receive NEDT certificates. Thirty-two students in the seventh grade, 33 in the eighth grade, and 28 in the ninth grade qualified for certificates of educational

development as the result of their outstanding performances on the National Educational Development Tests. These certificates are awarded to students whose composite scores are in the top 10 percent of their grades nationally. The NEDT offers an imper-

sonal estimate of educational development and provides information useful for present appraisal and future planning. The NEDT battery consists of tests in English usage, mathematics usage, social studies reading, natural sciences reading, and word usage.



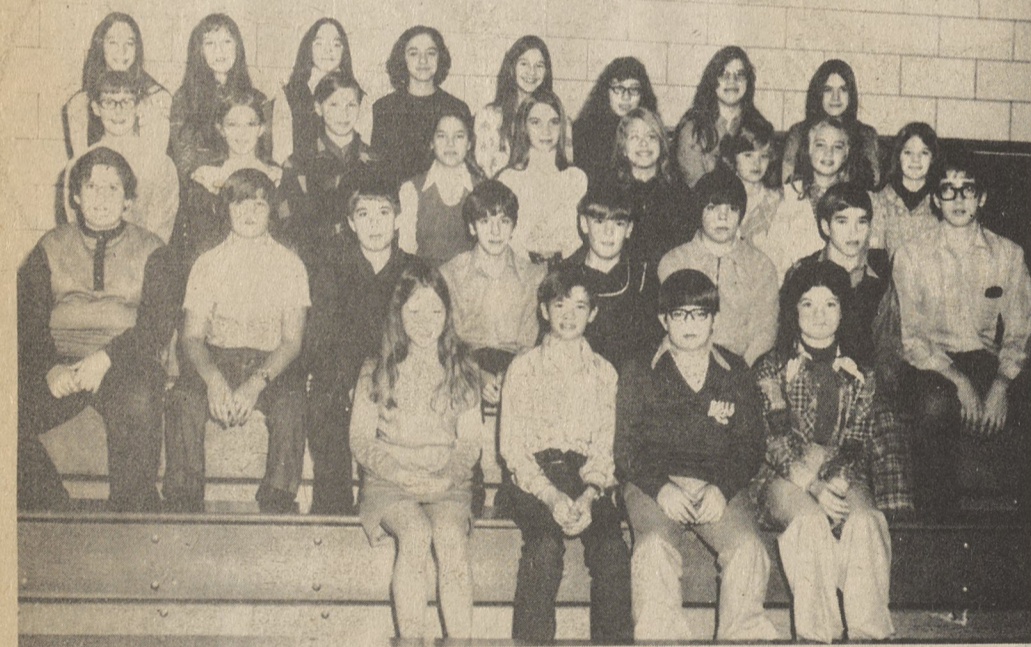

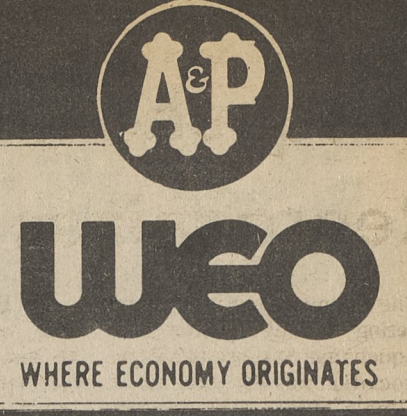
