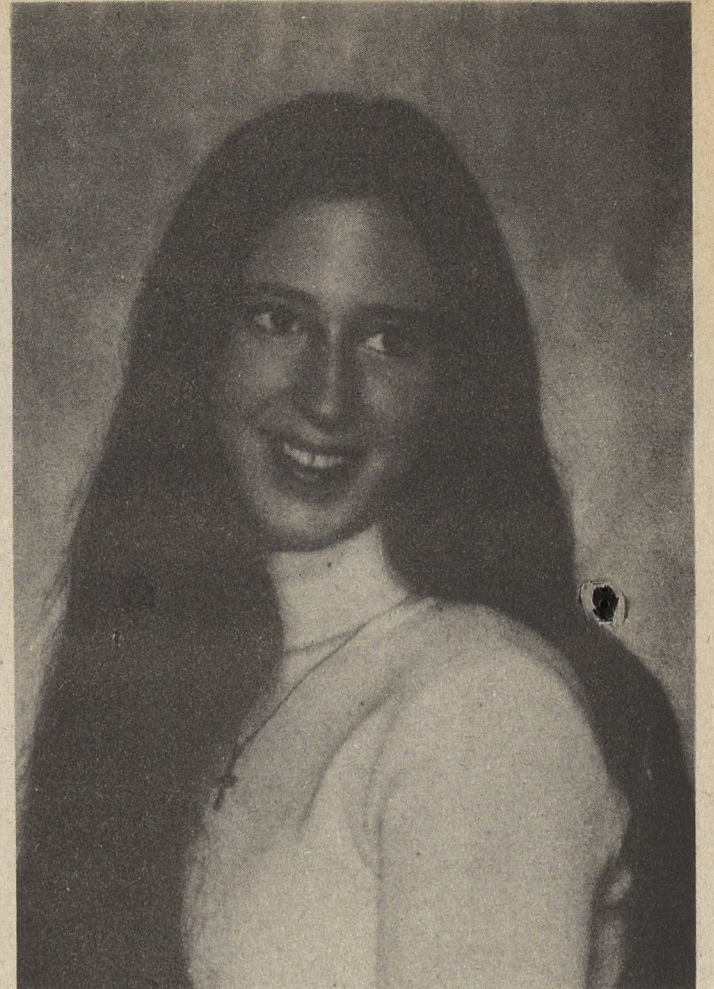
Mrs. Anthony presented Mrs. Ernest Thomas, retiring president, with a past president's charm bracelet.

Mr. and Mrs. Henry Doran, Sutton Road, had as their guests last weekend Mr. and Mrs. Walter Harris of Bear Lake.

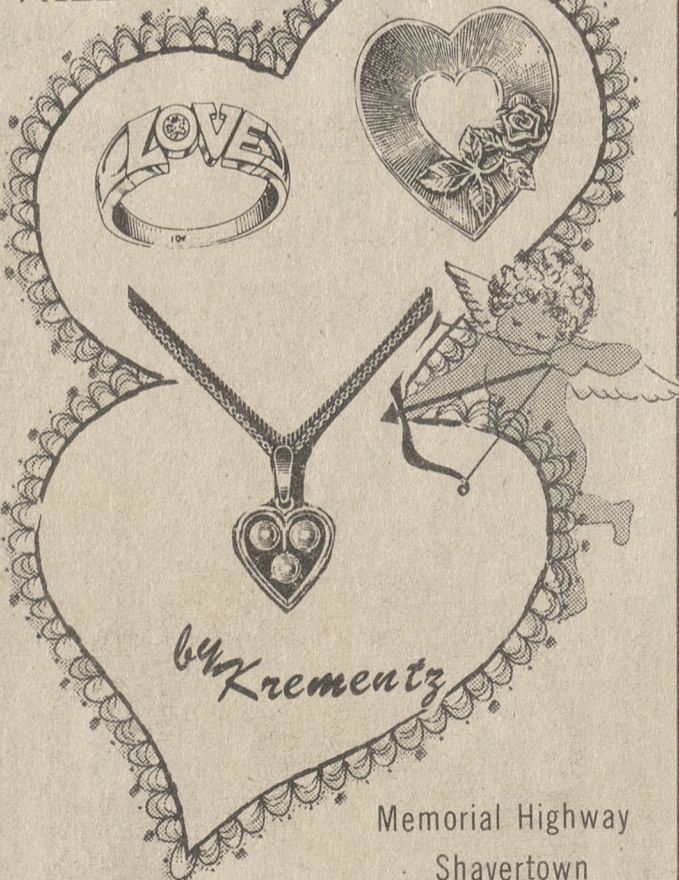
Mr. and Mrs. Ed Schellenberg, Orchard East, the Newberry Estate, have returned from a vacation in sunny Palm Beach, Fla.
