Shad Fishing Season Begins on Delaware

First reports of the annual spawning migration of adult American shad moving up the Delaware River have been received by the Pennsylvania Fish Commission with one catch of 23 reported at Martins Creek, about 20 miles south of the Delaware Water Gap. Fish Commission spokesmen say they are sure the shad will have reached the Delaware Water Gap by this weekend.

Fish Commission biologists, as well as federal biologists assigned to the Delaware River Anadromous Fishery Project headquartered at Rosemont, N.J., expect this year's run to be better than average. High water in the river has apparently enabled the shad to get through the pollution block created by domestic and industrial wastes in the Philadelphia-Camden area.

An anadromous species, shad live from three to five years in the ocean before returning to spawn in fresh water. Their annual migration runs can involve traveling over 2,400 miles. One shad tagged at Lambertville in mid-April last year was recovered by a commercial fisherman 126 days later in the Bay of Fundy off Nova Scotia.

In an effort to learn more about the shad's movements, abundance and the effect of pollution on its migrations, fishery biologists, using anchor gill nets, began tagging operations in the Delaware River last week. An orange plastic streamer, about three inches long, will be attached to the dorsal fin of each captured shad. Anglers landing tagged shad can receive a reward by sending the tag, along with information on location and date of catch, to the address printed on each streamer.

The Pennsylvania Fish Commission also announced this week that the first 7 million of a planned plant of over 50 million fertilized shad eggs have been placed in a tributary stream to the Susquehanna River. The eggs were collected from Indian tribes licensed to commercially harvest American shad running up Virginia's York River and several of its major tributaries.

The eggs are collected, flown to the Susquehanna River and released in Susquehanna River tributaries where water temperatures closely match temperatures in natal waters. This program is part of an intensive study of the possibilities of restoring shad runs to the Susquehanna which has been carried out through a

cooperative agreement between the state and federal governments and the public utilities which operate the Conowingo and other dams on the lower river.

The study also involves operation of a shad collection trap at Conowingo Dam where adult shad are caught and moved by tank truck around the dam for

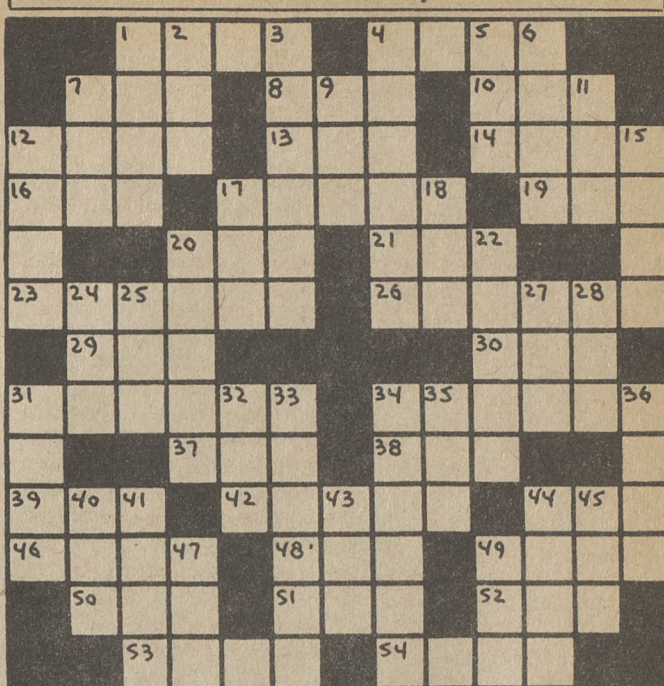
