resolution was adopted approving the budget for the school year 1974-75, which sets forth therein expenditures in the total amount of \$4,513,906.00, based on a tax levy of 62 mills per dollar (\$6.20 per hundred dollars of assessed valuation on real estate); a per capita tax of \$5.00 per taxable person, under authority of Section 679 of the Pennsylvania School Laws of 1949 and its amendments, and a reenactment of a per capita tax of \$5.00 per taxable person, under authority of Act 511 of December 31, 1965; a revision of Act 481 of June 25, 1947, without

substantial change, making a total of per capita taxes of \$10.00 to be levied and collected from each taxable person; in addition an earned income tax on wages, salaries, commissions, and other earned income of individuals at a rate of 1 percent, under authority of Act 511 of December 31, 1965, and a Real Estate Transfer Tax of 1 percent, shared 50-50 with the municipalities of the District, also under the authority of Act 511 of December 31, 1965. Said taxes are necessary for general revenue purposes to pay the salaries of the employees as prescribed in the salary schedules of the District and to meet the current expenses of the Dallas School District.
