

Bus Schedules and Routes Announced by Dallas Schools

James O. Brokenshire, assistant superintendent of the Dallas School District, announced the bus schedules for the first day of school, Sept. 4. Secondary starting time for the bus runs is approximately 7 a.m. and elementary starting time for the buses will be approximately 8:15 a.m.

Kindergarten students are reminded that they will only visit their rooms for the first day and that no bus service will be provided for them.

Rt. 1, secondary—Orange to Lake Louise to Orange to Dymond Hollow to James' Nursery, Demunds Corners to Applewood Manor to Junior and Senior High. Elementary—Orange to Lake Louise to Orange to Dymond Hollow to James' Nursery, Demunds Corners to Applewood Manor to Intermediate School and Dallas Township.

Rt. 2, secondary—Orange to Culver Hill to Eaton's Corners to Moore's Store to Fernbrook to the Junior and Senior High. Elementary—Orange to Culver Hill to Eaton's Corners to Moore's Store to Intermediate and Dallas Township.

Rt. 3, secondary—Carverton to Lewis Corners via Memorial Shrine to Carverton to Sicker Road, Carverton Heights to Moore's Store to Hildebrandt Road to Junior and Senior High. Elementary—Carverton to Lewis Corners via Memorial Shrine to Carverton to Sicker Road, Carverton Heights to Harris Hill Road to Westmoreland, picking up 5 and 6th graders at Westmoreland and on to Intermediate.

Rt. 4, secondary—Carverton to Lewis Corners via Bodle Road to Carverton to Saze's Corners via Carverton Road to Trucksville via Rt. 309 to Junior and Senior High. Elementary—Carverton to Lewis Corners via Bodle Road to Carverton to Saze's Corners via Carverton Road to Trucksville Elementary to Westmoreland and Intermediate.

Rt. 5, secondary—Bunker Hill to Meadowcrest thru Meadowcrest to Carverton Road to Trucksville via Rt. 309 to Junior and Senior High. Elementary—Bunker Hill to Meadowcrest thru Meadowcrest to Carverton Road to Trucksville Elementary to Westmoreland and Intermediate.

Rt. 6, secondary—Beaumont to Kunkle to Alderson to Ellsworth Hill to Kunkle to the Wyoming County line via route 92 to Kunkle via 309 to the Junior and Senior High. Elementary—Beaumont to Kunkle to Alderson to Ellsworth Hill to Kunkle via 309 to Dallas Township and Intermediate.

Rt. 7, secondary—Kunkle to Lake Catalpa to Demunds to Fernbrook to Junior and Senior High. Elementary—Kunkle to the Wyoming County line via old route 92 to Kunkle via 309 to Lake Catalpa to Demunds Corners, Whitesells Trailer Park, to Dallas Intermediate and Dallas Township.

Rt. 8, secondary—Cairn's Store to Trucksville via 309 to Lutheran Church to Junior High. Elementary—West Dallas to Hayes Corners, old Lake Road, Whitesell Bros., Castle Inn, and St. Country Club Road to Dallas Elementary, Dallas Township and Intermediate. Starting at Fernbrook Corners, up East Overbrook to Pioneer Ave to Trucksville and Westmoreland. (Home trip will be by Bus 17)

Rt. 9, secondary—Upper Demunds to Applewood Manor to Demunds Road to Whitesell's Trailer Park via Hildebrandt Road to Junior High and Senior High.

Rt. 10, secondary—Newberry Estate via Pioneer Ave. to Trucksville via 309 to Junior High and to Gate of Heaven. Elementary—Trucksville via Harris Hill Road to Westmoreland and Intermediate.

Rt. 11, secondary—Fernbrook via Overbrook Ave to Huntsville Dam, down Huntsville Road to Gate of Heaven and Junior and Senior High. Elementary—Pioneer Ave to West Overbrook Ave, to Huntsville Dam, to Dallas Borough, Dallas Township and Intermediate; starting again at Parker Fuel, up Beech St., to Goeringer Hill, down Center St., to Westmoreland.

Rt. 12, secondary—Trucksville via Pioneer Ave to Senior High to Dallas to Shavertown, on to Trucksville and to the West Side Voc-Tech School.

Rt. 13, secondary—Starting at Goeringer's to Midway Manor to Meadowcrest to Trucksville to Junior and Senior High. Elementary—Meadowcrest to Trucksville Gardens to Trucksville to Pioneer Ave and Intermediate.

Rt. 14, secondary—Trucksville via Lehigh St. to Junior High.

Rt. 15, secondary—Trucksville Gardens to Trucksville to Senior High. Elementary—Midway Manor to Brown Manor to Checkerboard to Trucksville, Westmoreland and on to Intermediate and Dallas Township.

Rt. 16, secondary—West Dallas to Junior High and Senior High. Elementary—West Dallas to Haddonfield Hills through Elmcrest to Dallas Elementary and Intermediate.

Rt. 17, secondary—Trucksville via Pioneer Ave to Gate of Heaven and to Senior High.

Rt. 18, secondary—Demunds to Fernbrook to Gate of Heaven to Senior High.

Rt. 19, secondary—Harris Hill Road to Center St., cross 309 to Pioneer Ave to Dallas to Junior and Senior High. Elementary—Midway Manor to Moore's Store, to Conyngham Ave to Intermediate and Dallas Township.

Rt. 20, secondary—West Dallas to Machell Ave to Sterling Ave to Junior and Senior High.

Rt. 21, secondary—Shavertown via Lehigh St to Harris Hill Road to Midway Manor to Checkerboard to Meadowcrest to Gate of Heaven to Senior High. Elementary—Hall's Drug Store, up Center St., to Goeringer to Beech and down to Lower Demunds to Intermediate.

Rt. 22, secondary—Starting at Noon's Gas Station to College Manor, Haddonfield Hills to Lake St., Gate of Heaven, Parish Heights and on to Junior and Senior High.

Rt. 23, secondary—Starts at Senior High, to Dallas via Pioneer Ave to Shavertown Methodist Church, down Center St. to 309, into Bishop O'Reilly High School. Elementary—Starting at Conyngham Ave to Grandview Ave, Orchard View Terrace, out 309 to Dallas Township and Intermediate.

Any Gate of Heaven student not riding the buses listed below will ride the Dallas School District secondary buses to the junior high school, where they will be transported to Gate of Heaven School.

Bus 1—Huntsville Road, Parrish Heights, High Point acres to Gate of Heaven. Bus 17—New Goss Manor and Orchard View Terrace to Gate of Heaven. Bus 24—West Dallas, Haddonfield Hills, Elmcrest and Country Club Road to Gate of Heaven.

A.M. Kindergarten home at noon from Trucksville, (1 class, approx. 30 students). Trucksville Elementary to Carverton Road to Bunker Hill (Cuttens).

P.M. pickup of students for Trucksville P.M. session, (1 class, approx. 25 students). Starting at Checkerboard to Brown Manor via Carverton Road to Sax's Corners, left on to Wyoming-Orange Road to Burke's Ice Pond, to Grange Hall and Bodle Road to Memorial Shrine to Mt. Olivet to Carverton Heights, to Harris Hill Road to Trucksville Elementary.

A.M. Kindergarten home at noon from Dallas Township, (1 class, approx. 30 students). Dallas Township Elementary School to New Goss Manor, Orchard View Terrace to 309 to Elby's back up 309 to White Birch Trailer Park and Brandywine.

Rt. 25, secondary—Starts at Senior High, to Dallas via Pioneer Ave to Shavertown Methodist Church, down Center St. to 309, into Bishop O'Reilly High School. Elementary—Starting at Conyngham Ave to Grandview Ave, Orchard View Terrace, out 309 to Dallas Township and Intermediate.

"Alleluia!" filled the air this week in Dallas as more than 350 Sisters of Mercy celebrated their heritage and their role in local churches. Activities at Mercy Center and College Misericordia included a ceremony of reception, colorful procession, historical displays, multimedia presentations, prayer services, and just reminiscing. Highlighting the "Days of Celebration," from Aug. 19 through Aug. 22, were addresses by Sr. Concilia Moran, RSM, administrator general of the Sisters of Mercy of the Union; Sr. M. Silverius Shields, RSM, executive secretary of the Federation of the Sisters of Mercy of the Americas; and Sr. Jane Frances Kennedy, RSM, provincial administrator of the Province of Scranton.

On a twelve-foot Mercy Cross, a college designed by Sr. Siena Finley depicted the various apostolates of the community. A colorful procession took place Wednesday. The Sisters from Gate of Heaven convent as well as those on the campus of College Misericordia took part in the procession, carrying banners of the procession, carrying banners depicting their role in the local church. The Gate of Heaven Banner, created by Amelia Yarmel, faculty member from Edwardsville, was a picture "painted" in yards of different colors. College Misericordia's banner of the college seal was created by Sr. Sharon Gallagher, RSM.

Thursday morning two young women were accepted into the community in a ceremony of reception in which they received the updated rule of the group, the Mercy Covenant.

The Most Rev. J. Carroll McCormick, D.D., Bishop of Scranton, honored the festi-

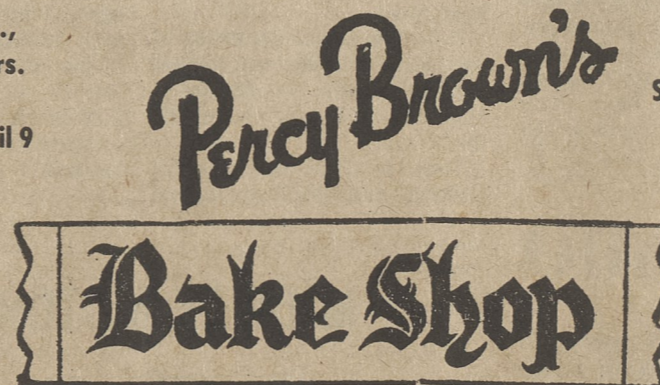

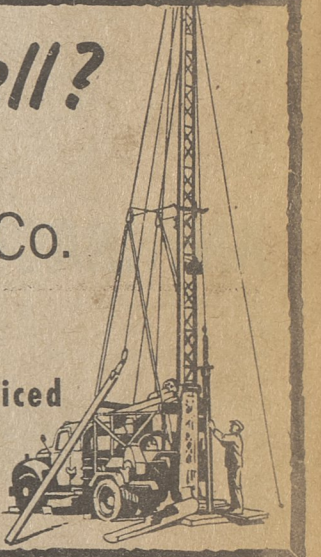

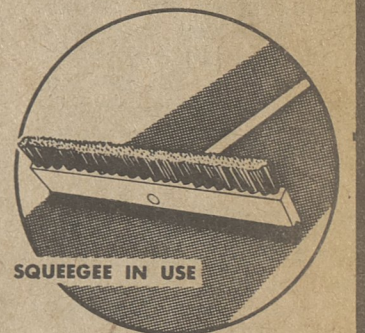
