## **Frout Being Stocked in 52** akes for Winter Season

It's trout stocking time again. he Pennsylvania Fish Comnission has started moving over 100,000 legal-size trout rom a number of its fish culure stations to 52 lakes in 36 counties in preparation for the 974-75 winter trout fishing season which opens at 8 a.m., Dec.

Trout shipments for the winer season are made in two phases with approximately 50,000 trout released prior to Dec. 1 and the other 50,000 trout tocked prior to the Christmas holiday season. This year, for the first time, winter trout stocking numbers are included in the new county allocation system started by the Fish Commission last spring. Only brook and rainbow trout are used for the winter stocking program except for Lake Wallenpaupack, Pike and Wayne Counties, which receives some brown trout.

The 52 lakes being stocked with trout this year represent an increase of five over the number of lakes or ponds stocked last year. These include lowaccording to the Game Com- and closes at sunset, Dec. 14.
