

# PennDOT to finance sewers

R. Spencer Martin, Dallas Area Municipal Authority, announced that Penn Dot will lend the authority (DAMA) the money to install sewers in the Carverton Road area of Trucksville.

Following approval of installation plans by both Penn Dot and DAMA, The sewers will be installed at a cost of approximately \$82,000 rather than the some \$154,000 estimate after the road had been completed.

Martin stated that Rep. Frank O. Connell intervened on behalf of DAMA.

Discussion ensued on the property located at the corner of Lake Street and Country Club Road, Dallas, owned by the United Greek Orthodox Church. It was noted that part of the land is a cemetery and the remainder is land which could produce future revenue for DAMA. The authority moved and seconded to exempt 175 front footage of the land.

Plant Manager Tom Bagley presented the audit to the board for approval and noted that the UGI monthly bill was \$2,794, an increase of over \$900 for the same period last year with no additional use of kilowatts. John Hibbard, Kingston Twp. representative to DAMA, went on record that the audit did not show

adequate rate structure and asked that this be researched. An advance of \$463 by P.J. Schalm III for construction at Brandywine Apartments was included in the audit and DAME voted to credit this amount to the \$7,000 owed the authority by Schalm.

John Hibbard questioned the balance of \$686,000 shown at the end of the year and asked if consideration had been given to putting this money into lucrative investments. Board members explained that United Penn Bank purchases certificates of deposit for DAMA. Bagley explained that copies of the audit will be sent to all municipalities, Department of Community Affairs, and to news media for publication. Audit was approved as presented.

William Carroll, Dallas councilman and engineer, requested proper procedure for development of property on Powderhorn Drive by D. Jones. Jones has presented a zoning request to the borough council which they planned to act upon this week. Jones has a total of 3 1/2 acres and his property is approximately 150 feet from the sewer line which runs parallel to Sterling Avenue. CHairman Martin stated that Jones must first obtain approval from DAMA for sewer arrangements before going ahead with his plans.

Carroll also reported a recent in-

cident in the borough where a DAMA contractor had dug up a borough street without a permit and blocked traffic. DAMA requested Bagley to speak to the contractor about this and caution him about doing so in the future.

A question was presented from the audience as to who would be liable in the event Meadowcrest was sewered. It was explained that since this is a Luzerne County Housing Project, the rentals would be its responsibility and would not mean an increase in rates for other taxpayers. The project's private treatment plant has deficiencies.

Chairman Martin also reported that there has been further word on EPA upgrading process.

### Area responds to Miller family appeal

Two weeks ago, the Dallas Post issued an appeal for assistance on behalf of the Robert Miller family who were the victims of a tragedy caused by fire which destroyed their mobile home and killed four members of the family.

The response from the community has been generous. To date, the family has received \$92 in contributions. Other residents have contributed furniture, bedding, clothing, and a TV set. The Millers have expressed their appreciation for the contributions.

American motor company has the lead in the small car market. American Motors had been

chiefly producing compact cars before the slump occurred. He stated that he "definitely" felt an edge on the market because of use of this factor, and added that American

Motors is reading another low mileage economy car for the market.

All dealers contacted told of similar models in production or in the planning stage by all major companies. Even Cadillac, known for their large cars is developing the "Seville", an international sized vehicle, according to sales manager Pletcher.

David Bronsberger and Hughes Pontiac, Inc. Kingston, emphasized this concept, stating, "The standard

size car as we now know it is becoming a diminishing breed on the market." But this car will be different."

The next few months will sow the country's opinion on the matter. Tomorrow, when the rebate deadline arrives, and in the near future when the economy cars hit the market the car buying public with express their views in their purchases.

Charles Feldman, association PRESIDENT, NOTED "The trend in sales is upward."

He said dealers are looking for "A gradual climb in sales in the months ahead." Since he foresees no manufacturers extending rebates, and wily local figures as they ar, the optimism seems warranted for just such a trend.
