A young Dallas resident was seriously injured last Friday afternoon when the motorcycle he was driving collided with a 1970 Chevrolet at the intersection of East Center Hill Road and Church Street, Dallas.

Jerome Juris, 50 Hilldonia Ave., Dallas, was traveling from Church Street toward the Dallas Junior High School when the car driven by Trudy E. Gerchak, 150 Hemlock Drive, Dallas, pulled out from the stop sign.

Juris was unable to stop and hit the side of the car. The impact threw him

from the cycle into the upper part of the driver's side of the windshield. He received serious injuries of the face and head and was taken to Nesbitt Memorial Hospital in the Dallas ambulance.

John C. Urbanski, 14 Valley View Drive, Pringle, witness at the accident, stated that Juris was traveling toward the Dallas Junior High School when Miss Gerchak coming from Route 309 toward College Misericordia stopped for the stop sign and from the cycle was about 20 feet from

the intersection, pulled out.

Dallas Township Police Chief Carl Miers and Patrolman J. Gruver, investigating officers, estimated damage to the car at \$600, and to the motorcycle \$1100. Both vehicles were removed to Wesley's Citgo Station.

Juris is the son of Mr. and Mrs. John Juris, Hilldonia Avenue, Dallas. He is married to the former Cathy Heffner. Both are graduates of Dallas Senior High School.

The auction is July 11, 12 and 13 on the library auction grounds, 69 Main Street, Dallas.

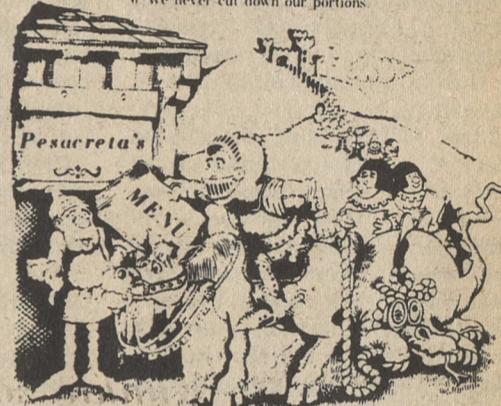

### ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED, by the Mayor and the Borough Council of Swoyersville, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania, and if hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same, as follows:  
SECTION 1: That the Borough Council of Swoyersville is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a written agreement between Pagnotti Coal Company, successor by merger to The Sullivan Trail Company, a Pennsylvania Corporation with its principal office located at 800 Exeter Avenue, West Pittston, Pa. and the Borough of Swoyersville, Luzerne County, Pa. or the sale of real property to said Borough in the Borough of Swoyersville, described as follows: Beginning at a point in the westerly line of the land owned by John K. Kober, et al., said point being located south 30 degrees 15 minutes east, 390.22 feet from the southerly line of Church Street on the division line between the westerly line of the school property and the easterly line of said Pagnotti Coal Company; thence south 30 degrees 15 minutes east 123.78 feet to a point; thence north 59 degrees 45 minutes east 200 feet to a point in the westerly line of Tripp Street; thence along same south 30 degrees 15 minutes east, 210 feet to a point; thence through said Pagnotti Coal Company south 59 degrees 45 minutes west, 560 feet more or less, to the easterly right of way line of the Harry M. Railroad branch; thence along same north 30 degrees 15 minutes west 33.78 feet to a point; thence 3.72 acres, more or less, for the sum of \$55,800.00.

SECTION 2: That the President of the Borough Council, the Mayor, and the Secretary of the Borough Council, be and they are hereby authorized and directed for the Borough of Swoyersville and under the seal of said Borough, to enter and written agreement between the Pagnotti Coal Company and the Borough of Swoyersville. Enacted and ordained at an adjourned regular meeting of the Borough Council of Swoyersville held the 16th day of June 1975.
