A young Dallas resident was seriously injured last Friday afternoon when the motorcycle he was driving collided with a 1970 Chevrolet at the intersection of East Center Hill Road and Church Street, Dallas.

Jerome Juris, 50 Hilldonia Ave., Dallas, was traveling from Church Street toward the Dallas Junior High School when the car driven by Trudy E. Gerchak, 150 Hemlock Drive, Dallas, pulled out from the stop sign.

Juris was unable to stop and hit the side of the car. The impact threw him

from the cycle into the upper part of the driver's side of the windshield. He received serious injuries of the face and head and was taken to Nesbitt Memorial Hospital in the Dallas ambulance
