AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEYS LAKE, LUZERNE COUNTY, PENN. SYLVANIA TO PROVIDE FOR AN AMENDED FEE SCHEDULE.

Section 1. Article 9 Section 9.610 and Section 9.640 of the Zoning Ordinance of the Borough of Harveys Lake is hereby amended to read as follows:
9.610 Fees for Zoning Permits not requiring Board action \$10.00.
9.640 application requiring Board action including appeals for variances, requests for amendments, applications for special uses, applications for rehearings on appeals and applications, \$75.00.
Section 2. All parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.
Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon final passage and publication as provided by law.
