John Weaver plays at St. Stephens

John Weaver, director of music at New York's Madison Avenue Presbyterian Church, will play an organ recital at St. Stephen's Church, South River Street, Wilkes-Barre on Nov. 3. The concert will feature Weaver, who will be accompanied on one selection by his wife Marianne, an excellent flutist, and is set to begin at 8 p.m.

Weaver is one of the most active concert organists in America, having played in

almost every major city. He has been guest soloist on the CBS television network, playing a program of contemporary French music from St. Thomas Church in New York. He also has made tapes for the ABC radio network and the German National Radio.

He was the first organist to play a recital on the new organ at the Philadelphia Academy of Music and received "superb" notices in the Philadelphia Inquirer following the recital.

Weaver is presently head of the organ department at the Curtis Institute, and previously served on the faculties of the Union Theological Seminary, School of Sacred Music and Westminster Choir College.
