## L-L second in Troy tourney

The Lake-Lehman Knights finished second in the Troy Wrestling Tournament with 109 1/2 points, 18 1/2 points behind Troy.

The Knights had two grapplers finishing first, four in second, two in third and one coming in fourth.

Dan White (LL) was defeated 7-2 by 98 lb. Neville of Northeast, 105 lb. Delycure, Loyalsock,

pinned Kelly Traver in 5:02. The Knights' 112 lb. Dave Kyle decided Enderly of Elk Lake 21-4 and pinned Harvey of Northeast in 5:44. He placed first by decisioning Mitchell of Troy 3-0.

Lew Thomas (LL) 119 lb., pinned Small of Canton in 1:47. In the semi-finals he dropped a 7-0 decision to Wolfe of Northeast. He finished third by outwrestling Brian of Liberty 8-0.

Troy's 126 lb. Hawkins defeated the Knights' Tom Tranel 4-3. Kevin Jones (LL) at 132 lb. pinned Brown of Elkland in 2:16. In the semi-finals he clamped Liggett of Canton in 3:07. He came in second in the tourney when he was decided by Hildebrandt, who was named outstanding wrestler in the two-day match.

Swire placed fourth when he lost in the consolation bout to Anderson of Loyalsock on a 5-1 decision. Swire took his first round by outwrestling Birdman of Northeast 6-4. He was pinned in the semifinals in 1:06 by Rockwell of Canton.

Dave Sutliff, 167 lb. (LL) copped the title in his weight class by pinning Cook of Northeast in 3:23 in the quarter finals, clamping Ward of Canton in 5:41 and taking Cable of Troy

by an 8-5 decision in the finals.

Paul Cilvik (LL) defeated Russell of Northeast 5-3 in the 185 lb. bout, then was turned over by Kittle of Troy in 3:51. In the consolation bout Cilvik pinned Marks in 2:32.

Mark Dragon placed second when he lost a 6-2 bout to Leonard of Troy in the finals. Prior to that he drew a bye in the quarter finals and flattened Fowler of Loyalsock in 5:49 in the semi-finals.
