**Library board appoints Mainwaring**

The board of the Back Mt. Memorial Library recently appointed Mrs. William Mainwaring to fill a vacancy on the board. Mrs. George McCutcheon, chairman of the nominating committee, reported that Mrs. Mainwaring has joined the board representing Jackson Twp. to fill the vacancy of Mrs. Tony Sharpe, who resigned.

Ralph Lewis, treasurer, reported a number of outstanding debts from last year's library auction. It is hoped that the new auction committee can begin free and clear. The report of the librarian, Mrs. Patricia Broida, showed a total of 6100 books circulated for the month of April. Among these were 128 new borrowers. A total of 163 new books were added to

the library. During the month, Mrs. Claire Esposito of Mountaintop gave a working demonstration of quilting, a craft popular in Colonial and Revolutionary times. This is part of the Wilkes Barre district library's Bicentennial crafts project. More

demonstrations are planned for the Fall. Participants included 20 fourth graders from the Dallas Elementary School. Another activity was a belly dance demonstration for the story hour mothers given by Mrs. Gail Butkiewicz of the Wilkes Barre YWCA.

First and second grad classes from Trucksville were introduced to the Library with a tour and a talk by Mrs. Charles S. Frantz about what it was like to be a child in Revolutionary times. Mrs. Frantz was dressed in the appropriate costume and showed various tools from the Wyoming Valley's Historical Society's museum. Mrs. Frantz is president of the Historical Society.

The library has been officially endorsed by the Luzerne County Bicentennial Commission.
