DALLAS TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 1976-2
GRADING OUT AND OPENING ORCHARD STREET

Be it ordained and enacted by the Board of Supervisors of Dallas Township as follows:

Section 1. Orchard Street, as hereinafter described, is hereby laid out and opened as a public road, such road, in the judgment of the Supervisors, being necessary.

Section 2. Orchard Street begins at a point on the boundary line between Dallas Borough and Dallas Township, such point being the southerly corner of a strip of land conveyed by Most Reverend J. Carroll McCormick, Bishop of the Diocese of Scranton, Trustee for Sacred Heart of Jesus Roman Catholic Parish, to Dallas Borough and conveyed by Dallas Borough to Dallas Township on September 3, 1976, and extends therefrom along the westerly boundary of said Orchard Street, the following courses and distances:

1. North four degrees no minutes East (N. 4°00') 46.66 feet;
2. Along a curve to the left having a radius of 135.75 feet, an arc length of 75.55 feet and a chord course of North 11 degrees 56 minutes 27.5 seconds West (N. 11°56'27.5" W.) a distance of 74.58 feet to a point of tangency;
3. In a Northwesterly direction on a course of North 28 degrees 52 minutes 55 seconds West (N. 28°52'55" W.) a distance of 229.62 feet to a point of curve;
4. Along a curve to the right having a radius of 1160.92 feet, an arc length of 136.99 feet and a chord course of North 24 degrees 27 minutes 07.5 seconds West (N. 24°27'07.5" W.) a distance of 138.92 feet to a point of tangency;
5. In a Northwesterly direction on a course of North 21 degrees 1 minute 20 seconds West (N. 21°01'20" W.) a distance of 160.15 feet to a point of curve;
6. Along a curve to the right having a radius of 275.44 feet, an arc length of 58.98 feet and a chord course of North 14 degrees 53 minutes 15 seconds West (N. 14°53'15" W.) a distance of 57.84 feet to a point of tangency;
7. In a Northwesterly direction on a course of North 8 degrees 45 minutes 10 seconds West (N. 8°45'10" W.) a distance of 1.39 feet to a point, said point being located on the former Borough of Dallas and Dallas Township corporate boundary line.

Such road has a width of forty feet extending to the East from the westerly boundary as described. Said road is shown as shaded in red on the sketch by Leo A. Corbett, R.E., attached hereto and hereby made a part hereof. Said road has a length of 709.16 feet.

Section 3. The Secretary is directed to file a copy of this Ordinance, together with the map attached hereto, in the Office of the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of Luzerne County, Criminal Division, and also to file three copies with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation. The map attached to said Ordinance may be inspected at the Dallas Township Municipal Building at any time.
