Lake PTA to hear


Garinger

Cross Valley section set

for construction

State Transportation Secretary William H. Sherlock, assisted by state and local officials, today broke ground for the second section of the Cross Valley Expressway near Wilkes-Barre. This section, a 2.2 mile

limited access divided highway, will cost \$14.6 million to build. It will run from Route 309 in Courtdale Borough to Rutter Avenue in Kingston Borough where it will connect with the bridge across the North Branch of the Susquehanna River, currently under

The new highway is designed to reduce traffic congestion on Route 309, which presently runs through the streets of Wilkes-Barre and the boroughs across the river. Construction of the second section is scheduled to take three years. The project also goes through the Boroughs of Pringle, Luzerne and Forty-Fort.
