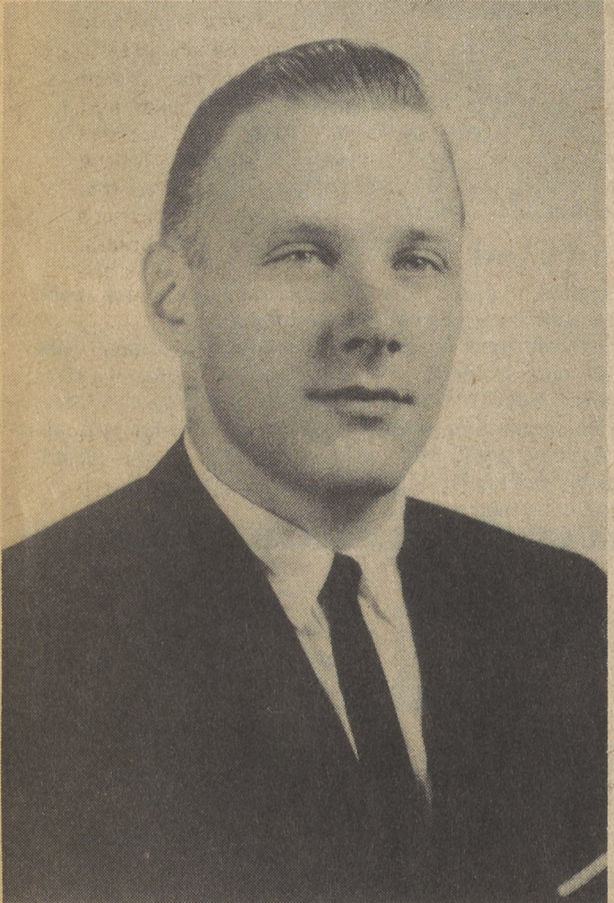

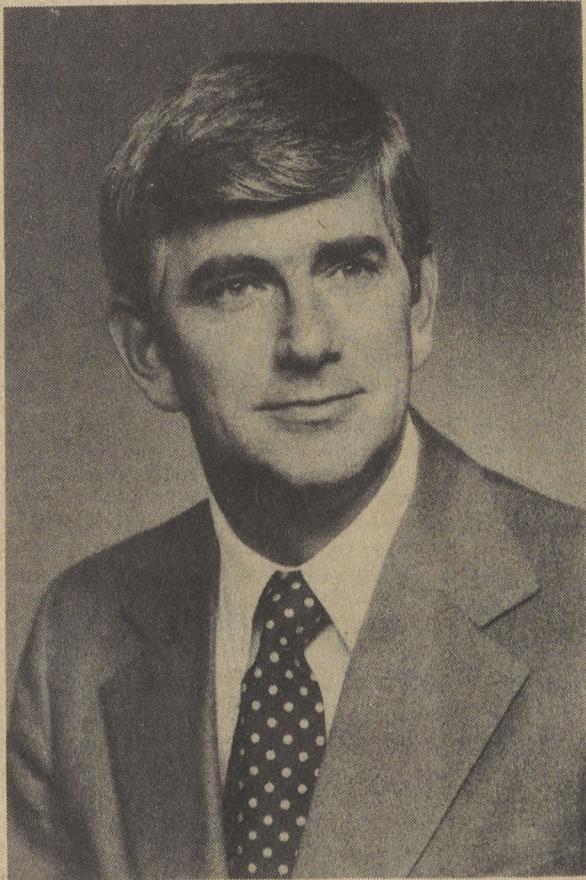
CM names captains for drive teams
