Mounts drop Lake-Lehman

Steve Skammer's shooting and rebounding led the Dallas Mountaineers to a 67-58 win over the Lake-Lehman Knights last Thursday, dropping the Knights to a 4-2 record.

Dallas went out in front early in the first quarter and held the lead throughout the first half, closing out the half 50-23. The Knights rallied in the second half but were unable to outscore the Mountaineers in either quarter. They came within one point of overcoming the

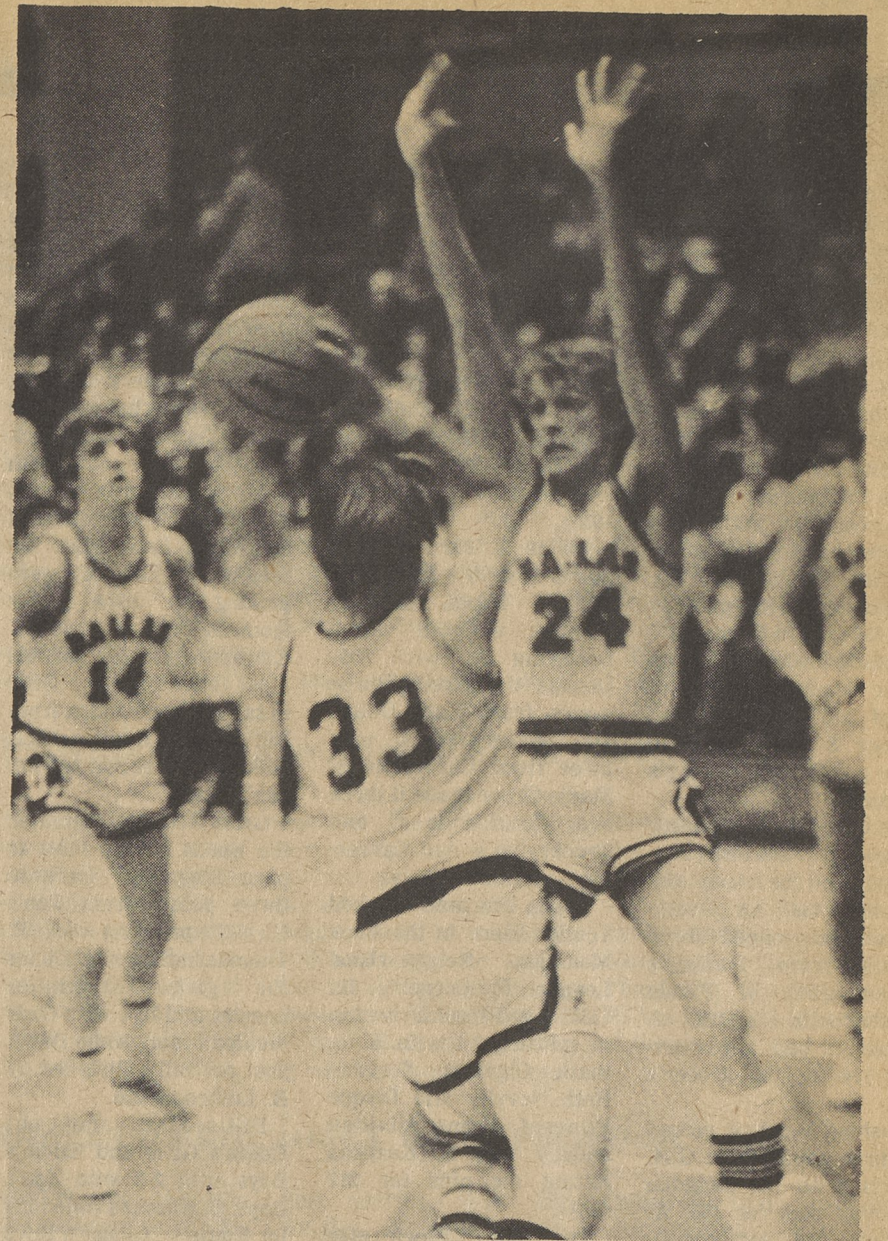
Dallas cagers but in the closing minutes of play, the Mountaineers took control and pulled ahead by nine.

Skammer set the pace for Coach Joe O'Donnell's Mountaineers with 24 points and 12 rebounds. He dumped in nine from the outside and made good six from the foul line. Sterling Machell hit the double figures tossing in three

from the floor and completing four from the charity stripe.

Dave Rushin hit 15 points for the Knights, six goals and three from the foul line. Kevin Coombs came through with 14 points and Bert Balliet added 12.

The Mountaineers completed 17 of 29 fouls; the Knights 10 of 17.

Dana Sutliff flattened Bob Osick in 2:25.

Heavyweight Ray Leskowski decisioned the Argents' top wrestler, Dave Choman, 6-3.

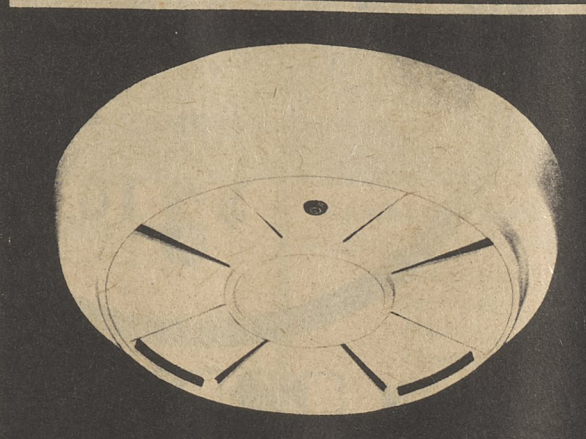
