two games by slim margin

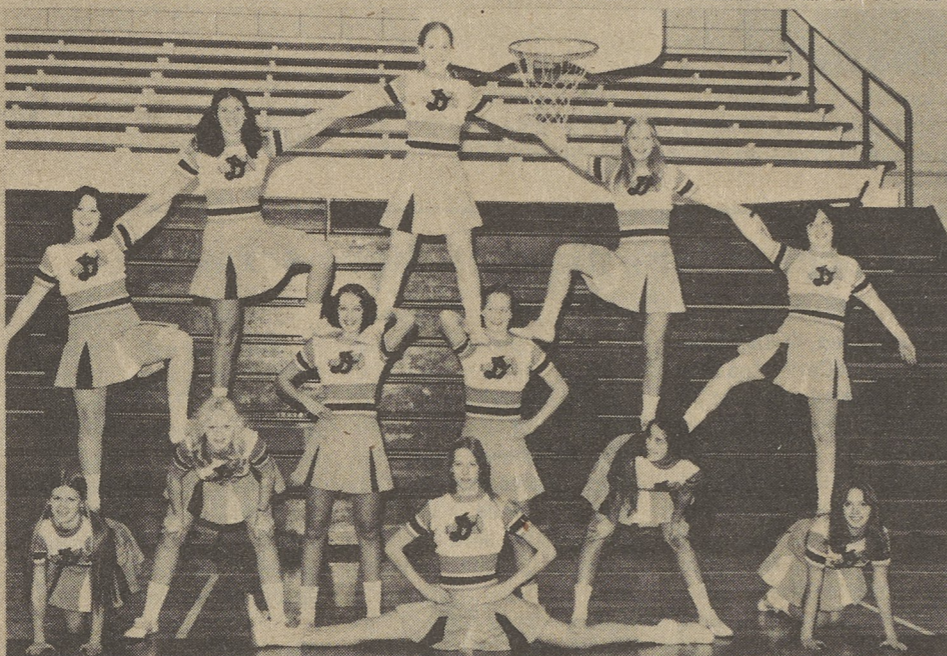
The Dallas Flyers dropped two games last week, each by one goal.

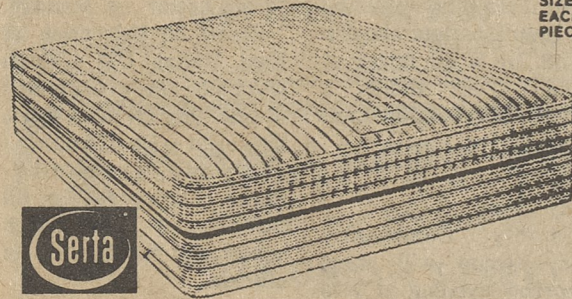

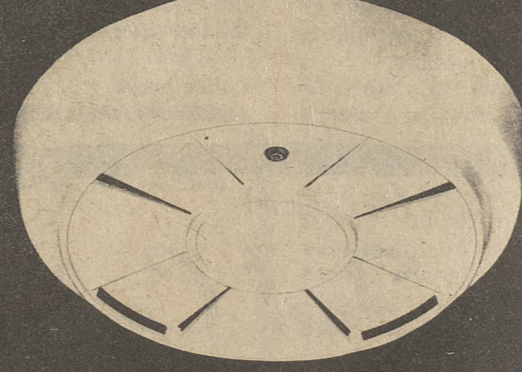
