

## Orfaly seeks Mayor at Harveys Lake

Benjamin Orfaly, 520 Lakeside Drive, Harveys Lake, is a candidate for mayor of Harveys Lake Borough on the Republican ticket. A semi-retired business man, he and his family moved to Harveys Lake in 1965, before the formation of the borough.

For years Orfaly has specialized in quilting machines sales, service and parts. He is gradually phasing out his business and, as a result, believes that he will be able to devote most of his time to the responsibilities of the mayor's office.

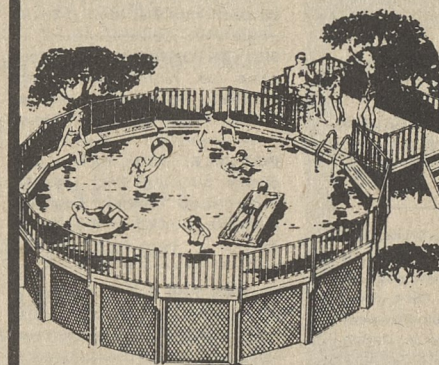

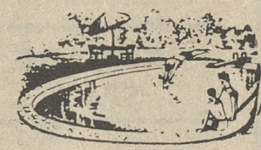

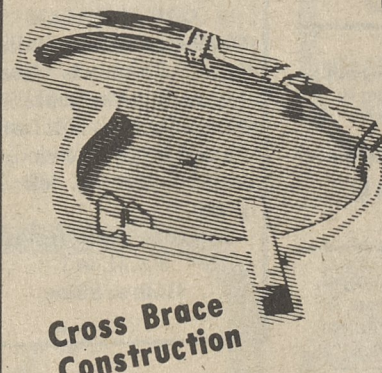
