letters for participating in golf and basketball at Dallas High School 1975-77.

He is a member of the Dallas High Track team at the present time and will graduate from Dallas High School in June, 1977. He has enrolled at West Chester State College for the Fall of 1977.

Stone has been active in the Dallas area in events such as the Bike-A-Thon for the Mentally Retarded in 1974-75; Walk-A-Thon for the March of Dimes 1974-75; assisted during the Great 1972 Flood disaster; has helped at Back Mountain Library Auction 1970 through 1973.

He participated in Troop 281 sponsored clean-up and paper drives; and has assisted and worked at Dallas Fall Fair sponsored by the service clubs of the Back Mountain each year.

He is a member of the Dallas United Methodist Church.

His Eagle Scout Project was the revitalizing and refurbishment of Rice Cemetery, the oldest cemetery in Dallas Borough, as Bicentennial project. The scout members of Troop 281 aided Craig in this project.

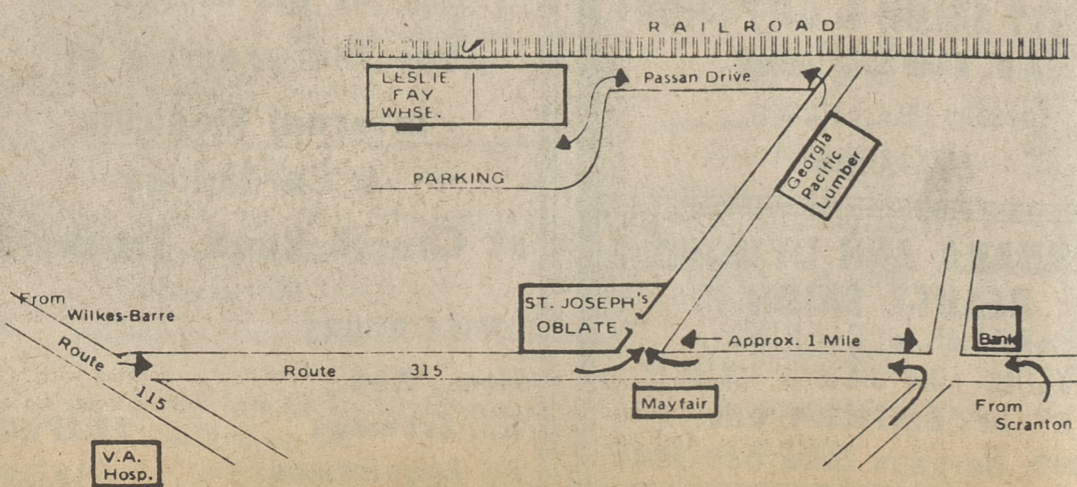

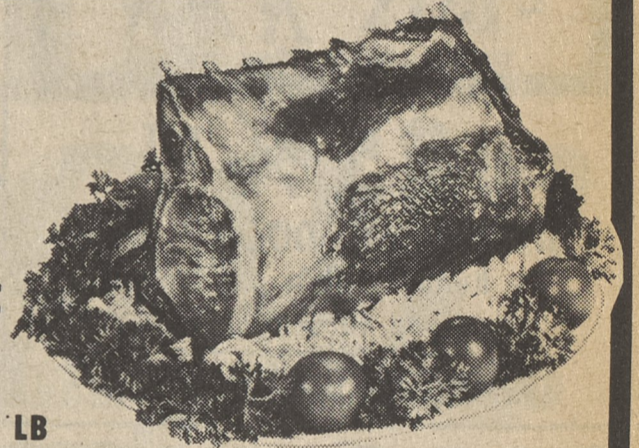
Tickets may be purchased from any chorus member or at the door. The concert will begin both nights at 8 p.m.
