

Booker to command Keystone Division

Adjutant General of Pennsylvania, announced the appointment of Brigadier General Fletcher C. Booker, Jr., Dallas, as the commanding general of the 28th Infantry Division, Pennsylvania Army National Guard to be effective May 12. The Headquarters of the

28th Infantry Division is located in Harrisburg. The 28th Infantry Division is located entirely within the boundaries of the Com-Division. monwealth of Pennsylvania with units located throughout the State. The division is referred to as The Keystone Division.

General Booker is the first local National Guardsman to achieve this high position in the 28th Infantry Division. General Booker's mili-




