The Kishkill's traveled to Brooklyn, N.Y. where they joined other members of John's family for a family

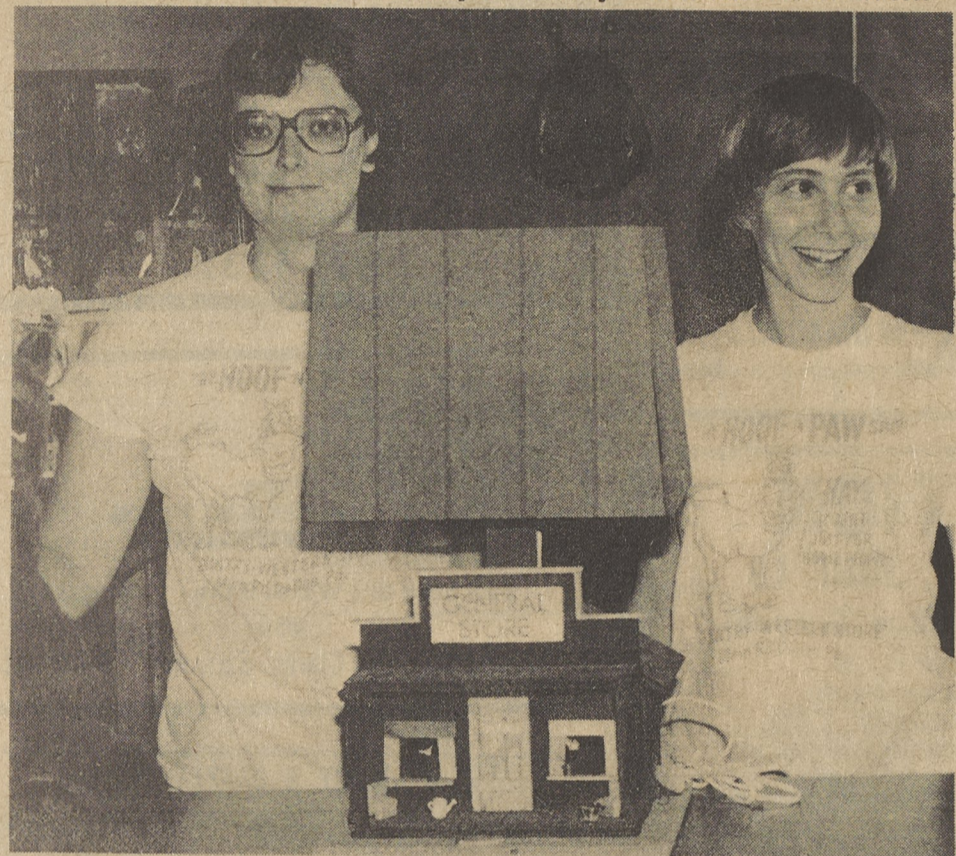
reunion.
