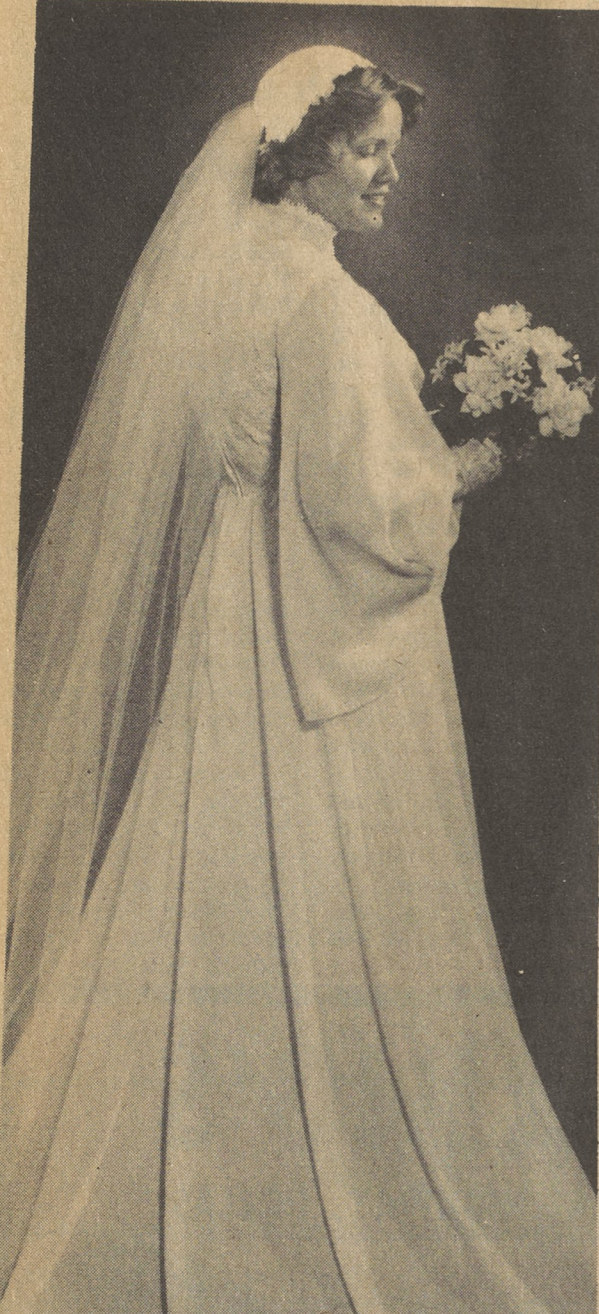
Kunkle UMW meets
