

Legion loses first half title

Back Mountain American Legion team lost their chance for the first half title in the Legion league on Saturday afternoon when they dropped a close 3-2 game to Pittston in the playoff.

Pittston, Back Mountain and North End finished the first half in a tie for first with 7-3 records to necessitate the playoffs. On Friday afternoon Pittston defeated North End 14-4 to continue against the Back Mountain team.

Pittston scored first, pushing two runs across in the third inning on Catcher Andrew Scavage's double.

Jeff Supulski drove in both runs for the Back Mountain in the fifth and seventh innings with doubles. Back Mountain rallied in the seventh inning and had the bases loaded when the game ended.

Steve Skammer pitched for the Back Mountain and fanned four while walking one. Turonis struck out five and walked eight but it was Lopresto's double and Scalzo's single with two out in the sixth that put the game on ice for the Pittston team.

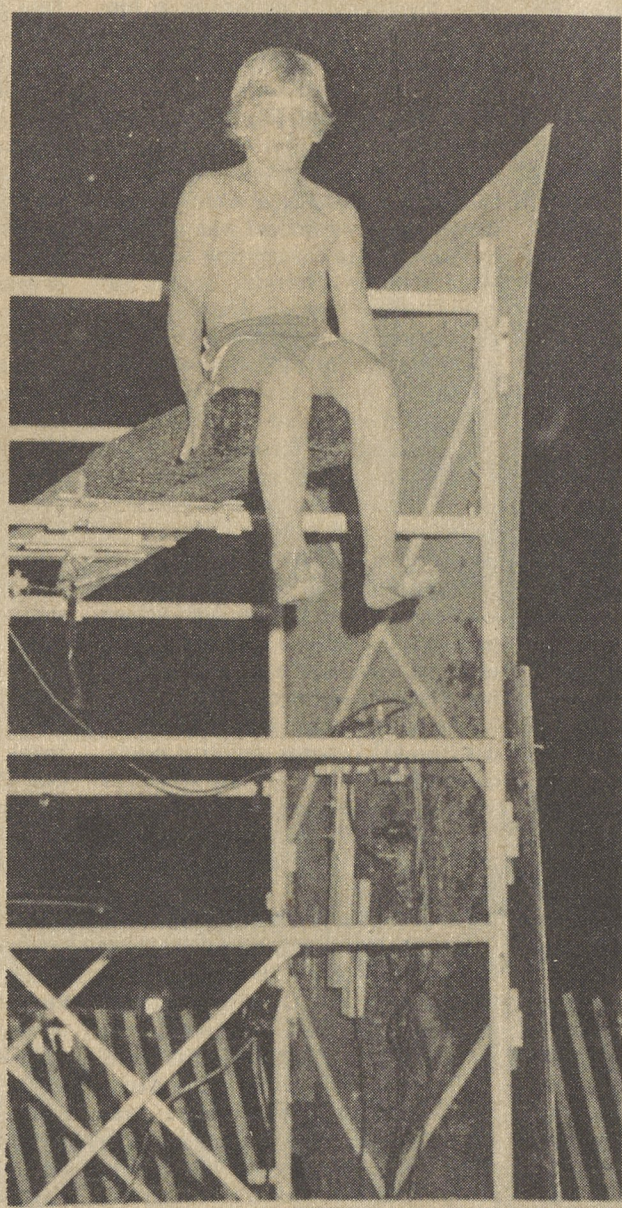
Varsity football physicals (grades 10 through 12) will be held on Aug. 2 at 10 a.m. at the high school. The head coach will organize for the season following the examinations.
