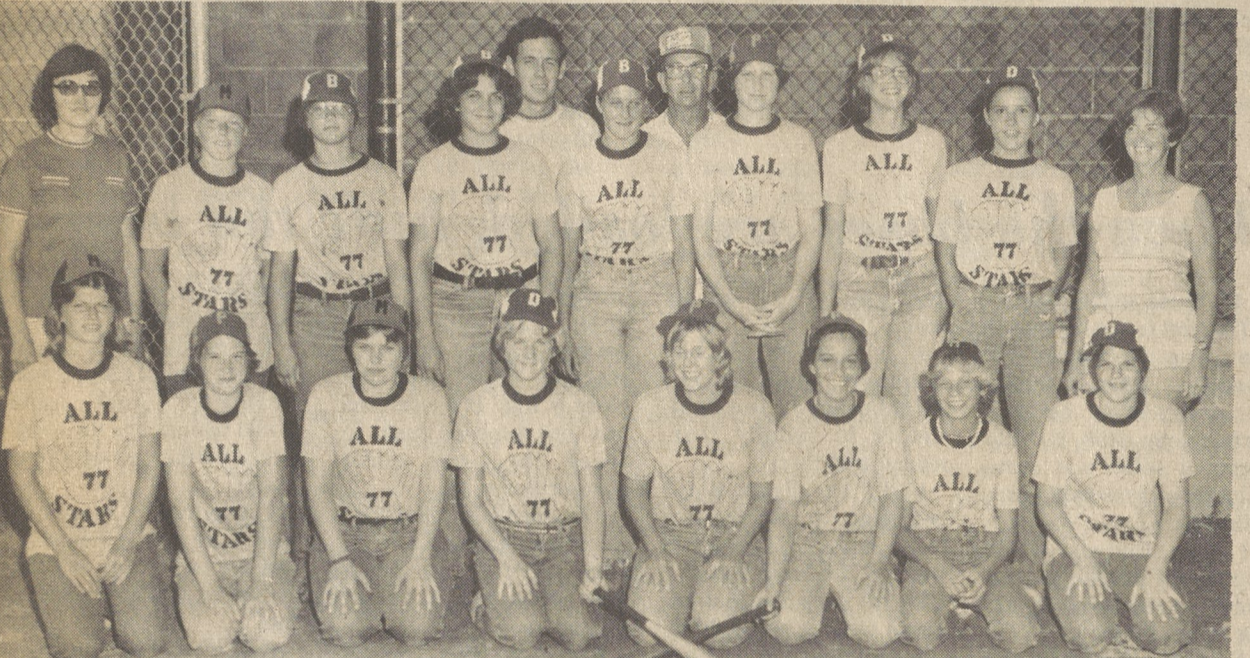
He is a 1971 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, Annapolis, Md., with a bachelor of science degree.

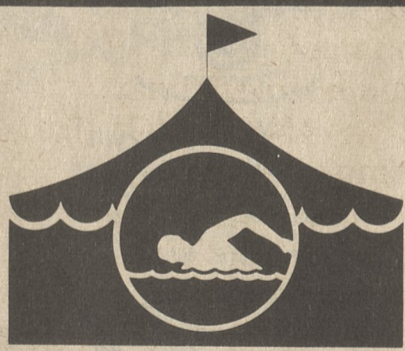
