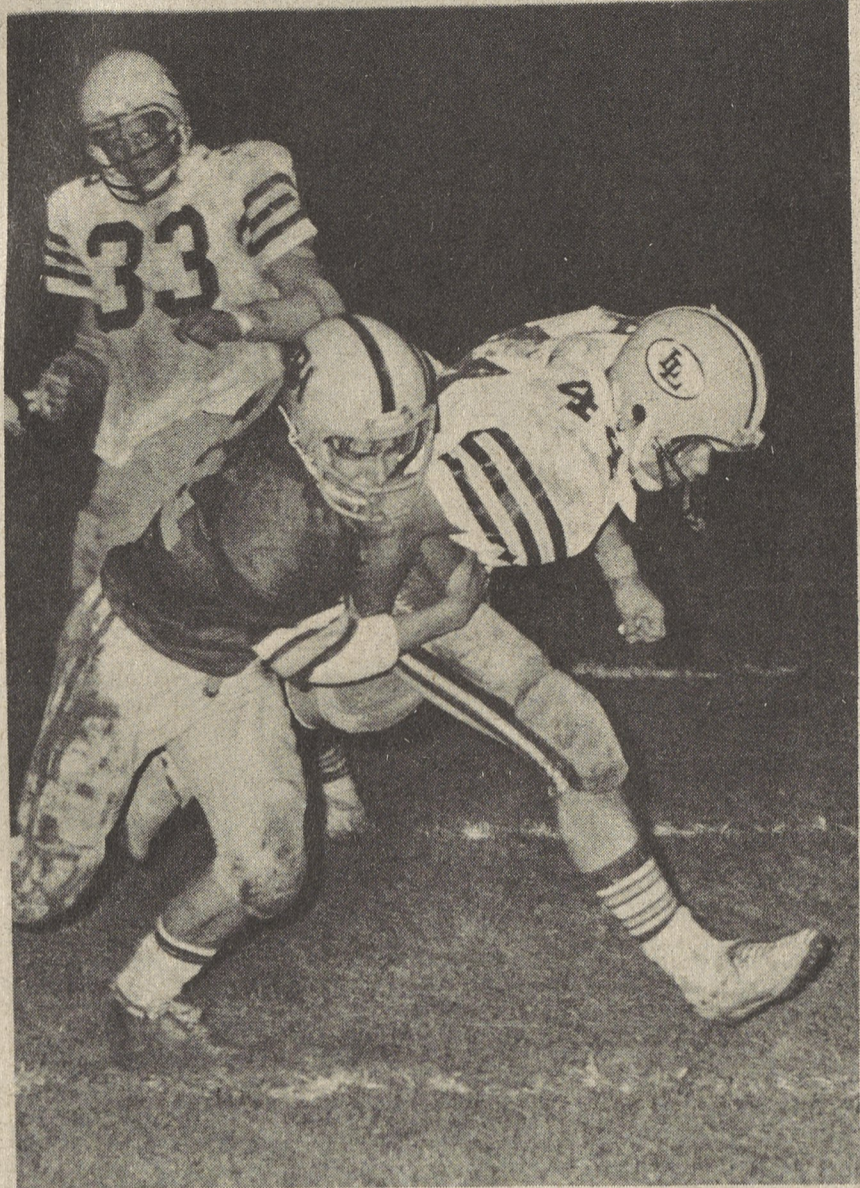

Spencer, Sutliff lead Knights

"I was very pleased with the team, they executed well and played an outstanding game," said Coach Rich Gorgone commenting on the Lake-Lehman Knights 34-7 win over Bishop Hoban on Saturday night.

"We broke a kickoff for a touchdown, passed well and had some good running. We played all of the boys during the final quarter. The kids put forth great effort and played one of their finest games of the season."

"Coughlin-we're concerned with the Crusaders, their size primarily. They do a lot of things well. Hanko is a good back and their quarterbacks throw the ball well."

"We have two strong games coming up-Coughlin, then Dallas, but if the kids play like they did Saturday night, we'll give both teams a good run for their money."

"All the boys played a great game, but Jim Spencer had a total of 102 yards and Dana Sutliff played a great game both ways, end on defense and tackle on offense."

The Knights took the

Argents 34-7 with Jack Swire, Ray Leskowski, Jim Spencer and Mark Thomas scoring the touchdowns. Thomas returned the kickoff at the opening of the second half for an 85-yard score.

Bert Balliet hit Bill Hardwick with a 10-yard touchdown pass for the Knights first score but the rest of the scoring was done

by the Lake-Lehman backs.

Jim Spencer ran up the middle for a 44-yard touchdown and Jack Swire went over the seven yard line climaxing a Knights 87-yard up the field. Al Evans kicked the extra point on each of the three scores to give the Knights a 21-0 lead at the half.

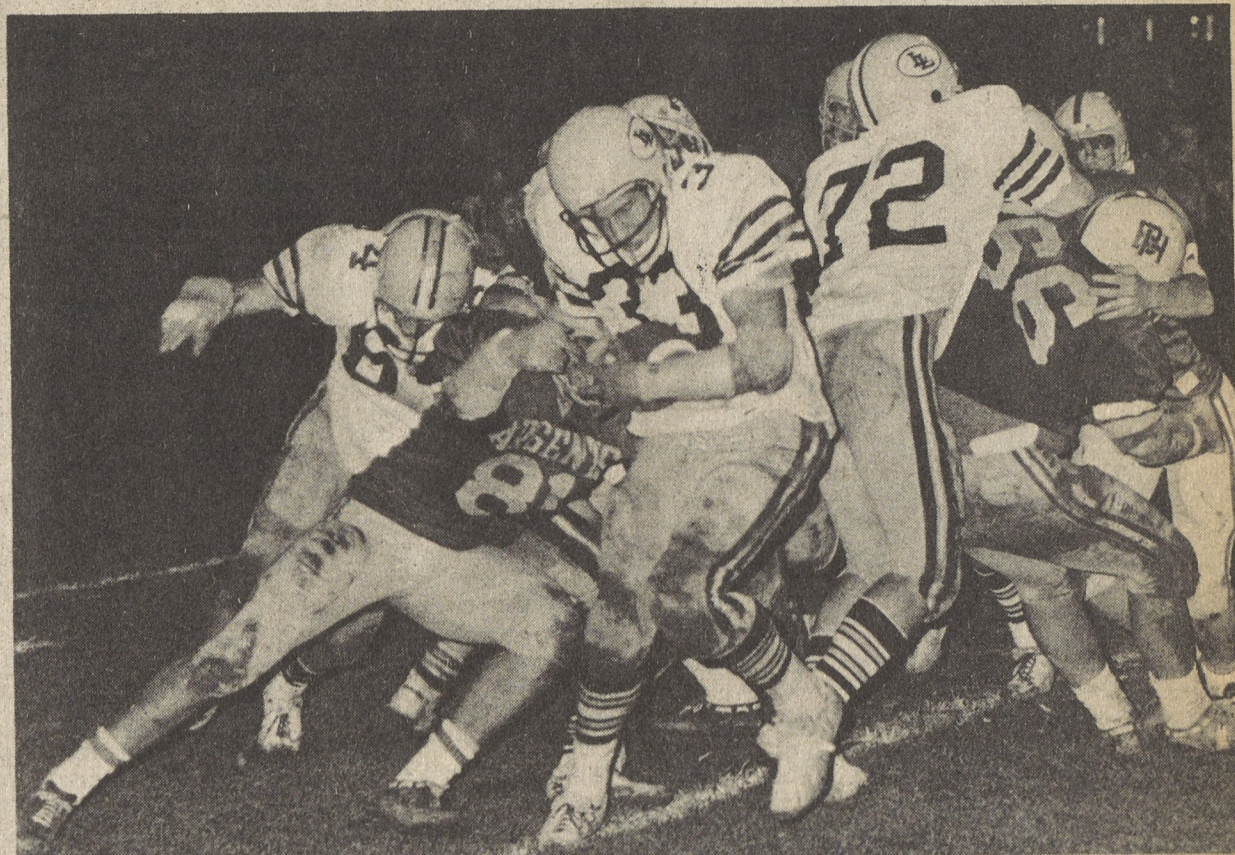
Thomas retrieved the

ball on the Argents 15-yard line on the second half kickoff and raced the 85 yards to score without looking back. Evans kicked the extra point.

Ray Leskowski scored the Knights final touchdown going over from the seven yard line. Evans missed his final kick of the game but the Knights went in from 34-0.

The Argents scored in the final quarter when Wilk went over from the three-yard line. His score capped the Argents 69-yard drive led by Joe Wild and Leon Ostrowski.

Roebuck kicked the extra point for Bishop Hoban. The Knights play Coughlin at the Plains stadium Friday night with game time at 7:30 p.m.

Jones proud of Dallas 'team effort'

"I'm very proud of the boys. They played with the same tremendous effort that they did against Pittston. The Coughlin team is loaded with talent and not to be taken lightly," said Coach Jack Jones of Dallas following his team's road victory over the Crusaders, 21-18.

"We have no super-stars on the team and I'm happy about that. The boys win together or lose together. A team is comparable to a chain-it's only as strong as its weakest link and no one wants to be the weakest link so they all put forth their best effort."

"Jerry McDowell did a

good job but so did Ken Kuderka and Bill Gray. Dave Gramps and Kuderka did some fine blocking. Eric Stolarick is seldom mentioned but he is always in there doing a consistently good job. Our center, Tom Reese, is in there plugging every minute."

"But you can't really single any one boy out, they are all trying to do their best-Ken Charney has been doing some excellent punting, giving us some hanging time and Brian Dennis has been giving us those extra points. Then there's Mark Casaday, Scott Asby, Abe Simon, and

on and on. It's difficult to name each one."

"Asby's punt run back was great. The kids practice punt and kickoff returns all week every week. It is tedious and often there is little or no reward. A run back like Asby's just once makes it all worthwhile."

Coach Jack Jones was referring to sophomore Scott Asby's 71-yard punt return in Friday night's game with Coughlin which put the Mountaineers on the board in the first quarter.

Asby picked up the return on the 29-yard and evaded Coughlin men to

race down the left sideline for a touchdown. Brian Dennis kicked the extra point to give Dallas a 7-0 lead.

The Crusaders came right back to take the Mounts kickoff to the Dallas nine yard line from where Terry Warren took Henry Goldowski's pass over for six points. The try for the extra point went

wide. In the second quarter, the Mountaineers drove for 53 yards with Charlie Falcone running in from the 10-yard line for a second Dallas touchdown. Dennis kicked his second extra point of the game and the half ended with Dallas in the lead 14-6.
