recommendation by the planning commission. Conditional uses permitted will be mobile home parks in R-1 districts; neighborhood shopping centers in B-1 district; and planned residential development in C or R-1 districts. Under supplementary regulations, non-conforming buildings and uses has been a subject for controversy. Continuation of non-conforming buildings and uses stipulates that any lawful use of any dwelling, building, structure or land existing at the effective date of this ordinance may be continued even though such use does

not conform to the provisions of this ordinance except as otherwise provided. Under changes of non-conforming buildings and uses, the zoning board may grant a special exception for a change from one non-conforming use to another non-conforming use if it finds that all of the stipulated standards are met, such as no structural alterations, no increases in traffic generation or congestion, no increase in the danger of fire or explosion, no increase in noise, smoke, dust, fumes, vapor, gases, heat, odor, glare, vibration, or electrical disturbances;

and no increased threat to health by reason of rodent infestation. These are only the most relevant or controversial sections. There are many more items to go over in the proposed Jackson Township zoning ordinance at the first meeting which will be held Dec. 19 at the Jackson Township Fire Hall. It is then that all residents may attend and recommend or give constructive criticism. It is then the Planning Commission hopes to resolve all problems and items of controversy for the benefit of all.

Why not keep them busy with interesting things to make. The Back Mountain Memorial Library has books that will provide suggestions for things that children of all ages can make—everything from doll making to model car construction. The library is for you and your family—why not take full advantage of it! The library celebrated Children's Book Week November 14 through 19th. The children's annex featured a display of antique children's books and a doll in the display case and children using the library were given free bookmarks. Also,

in honor of Children's Book Week, the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th grades from Dallas Borough School made small paper ornaments depicting their favorite book, which will be used to decorate a Christmas tree in the annex. Ellston Trevor has written a new novel called, "The Theta Syndrome" which has recently been added to the shelves of the library. This is a story of slow terror, of a mind imprisoned in a nightmare. An unexplained freeway crash had left Claudia Terman with severe brain damage: the attractive young victim lay in a coma, "dead" except that her brain was functioning feebly, in the theta-rhythm range, the twilight zone of consciousness. The only clue to a killer was the silent scream of a terrified brain! "The Grasp of Consciousness" action and concept in the young child,

by Jean Piaget reports the results of experiments conducted at the world-famed Center of Genetic Epistemology in Geneva, to distinguish between the child's ability to perform the actions required by a simple task and the child's understanding of the rationale behind the action.
