

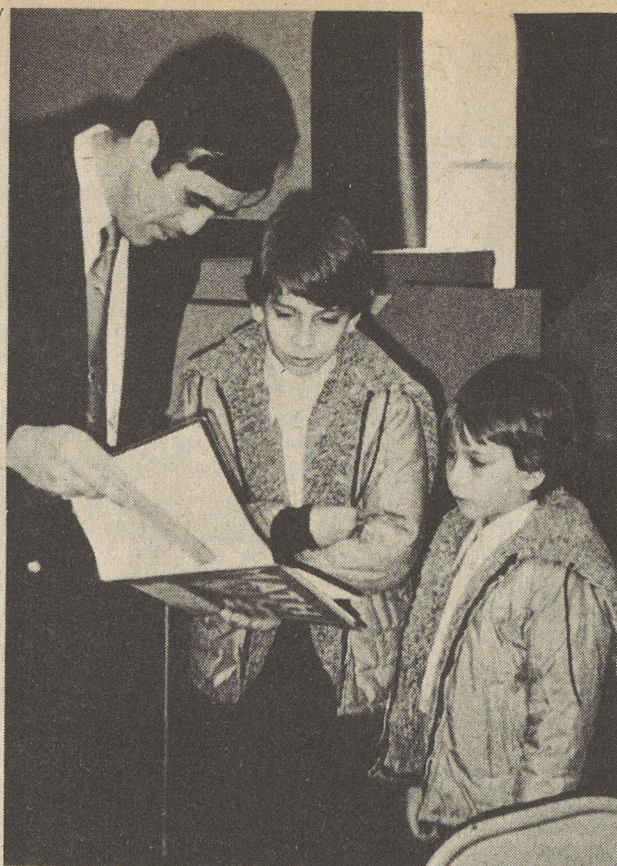

## L-L district plans school series

The Lake-Lehman School District will hold a series of public discussion meetings about public school. The five-part series, "People, Politics and the Public Schools", is designed to improve communication among parents, teachers, the administration and the school board.

Topics to be considered in the series are: Public School Organization, Jan. 16; Curriculum and Values, Jan. 23; Public School Law, Jan. 25; Financing the Schools, Jan. 30; and Decision Making in the Public School, February 1.

The meetings will be held in the Lehman-Jackson Elementary Building at 7 p.m.

The "People, Politics and the Public Schools" series was prepared by the Northeastern Penn-

sylvania Association for Continuing Education and the League of Woman Voters of the Wilkes-Barre Area. Funds were provided by the Public Committee for the Humanities in Pennsylvania, an affiliate of the National Endowment for the Humanities.

Each discussion meeting will feature a videotaped interview with an authority on the topic. The discussion will be led by a humanities professor from one of six local colleges.

The content of the series was developed by professors of art, history, English, government, sociology, and speech from College Misericordia, Kings College, Wilkes College, Luzerne County Community College and the Wilkes-Barre and Hazleton Campuses of the Pennsylvania State University.
