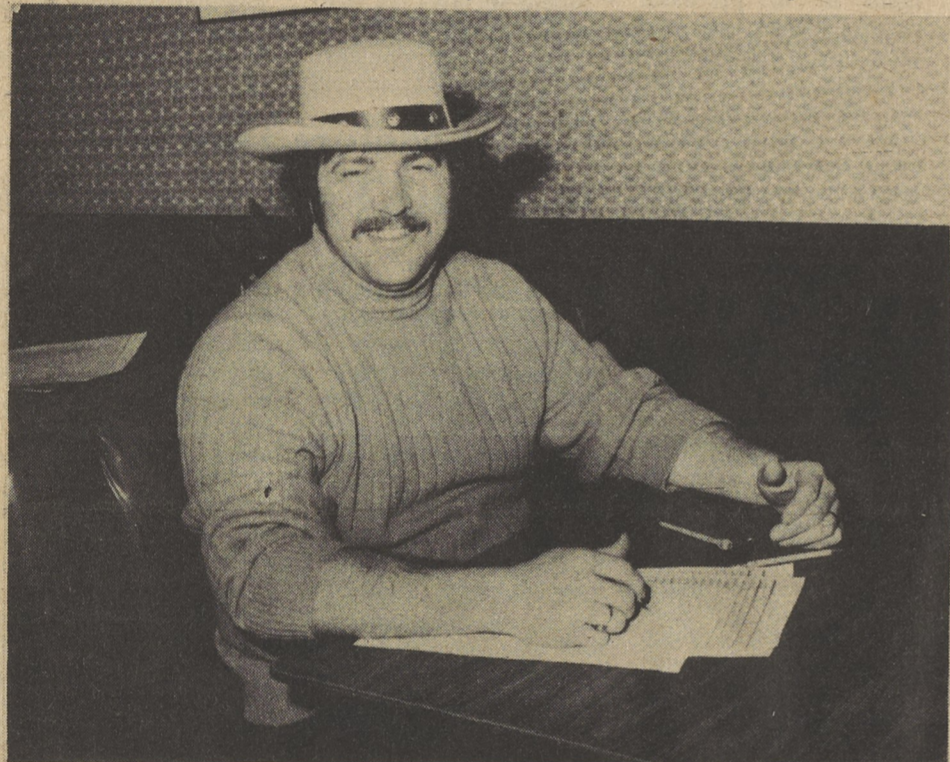
Wednesday, Feb. 1 at 8 p.m. at the Dallas Jr. High School auditorium.
