FRENCH ONION SOUP
3 med. onions (thinly sliced)
2 T. butter
1 T. flour
4 beef bouillon cubes
4 c. water
salt & pepper to taste
¼ c. milk, heat to boil
¼ lb. grated swiss or Parmesan cheese
buttered croutons

In heavy skillet, cook onions in heated butter until slightly browned. Sprinkle with flour and cook over low flame until golden not dark brown. Add cubes and water. Bring to boil stirring constantly with wooden spoon. Simmer gently for 20 minutes uncovered. Add milk. Pour into oven proof casserole or individual bowls. Place cubes of buttered croutons on top. Sprinkle generously with cheese. Brown quickly under broiler. Serves four to six.

MARINATED ANTI-PASTO

Clean and slice one pound fresh mushrooms one eighth inch thick. Slice half small head cauliflower. Pare two carrots and cut into two inch strips. Cut two stalks celery and one green pepper in one inch strips. Combine in saucepan with one jar drained pimento and one jar drained pitted olives. Add two chopped green onions. Combine quarter cup fresh lemon juice, half cup oil, three quarters cup wine vinegar, two tablespoons sugar, one teaspoon salt, half teaspoon oregano, quarter teaspoon pepper and quarter cup water. Pour over vegetables in saucepan. Bring to boil, stir and simmer (covered) for five minutes. Cool and refrigerate 24 hours. Drain and served with sesame crackers.

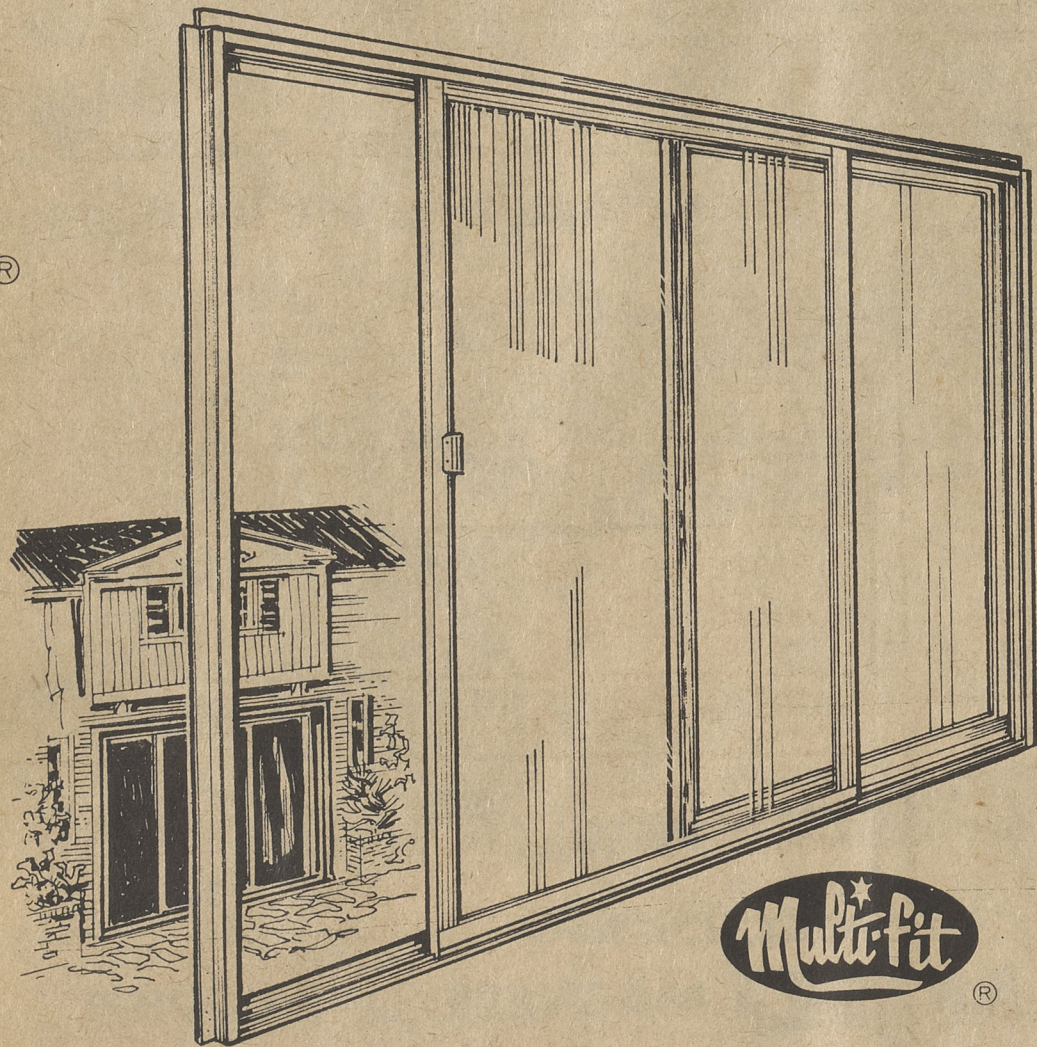
