

## Dallas kindergarten registration announced

Kindergarten registration for the 1978-79 school year will be held in the Dallas School District the week of April 3 in the library of the Dallas Township Elementary School from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. A birth certificate or other acceptable evidence of age must accompany each registration. A child must be five years of age on or before Sept. 30, 1978 to be eligible for kindergarten.

Those with last names

beginning with A through E will register on Monday, April 3; F to K on Tuesday, April 4; L to O on Wednesday, April 5; R to V on Thursday, April 6; and W to Z on Friday, April 7. The children who will enter first grade, but who did not attend the kindergarten program this past term, may also register on Friday, April 7.

As a result of Act 67, the state requires the following immunization by all new enrollees prior to entry into

school for the first time: diphtheria, tetanus, poliomyelitis, measles—a single dose of vaccine or the disease, rubella. Although whooping cough and mumps immunizations are not legally required, the Health Department recommends children receive these shots in infancy along with immunization.

Parents are requested to bring their child's immunization records to certify they meet the state

requirements. These records may be obtained from the family physician. If there is any medical reasons the child should not be fully immunized, bring a certificate from a physician stating the reason. If a parent objects to immunizations for religious reasons, the state requires the parent to sign a form to that effect at school. It is essential to register all kindergarten students during the week of April 3 as problems occur with class assignments and transportation when students register late.

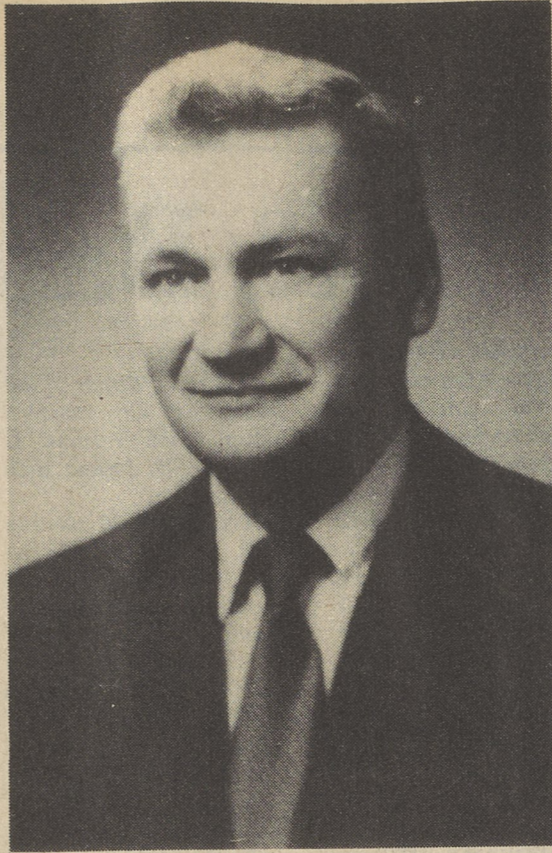

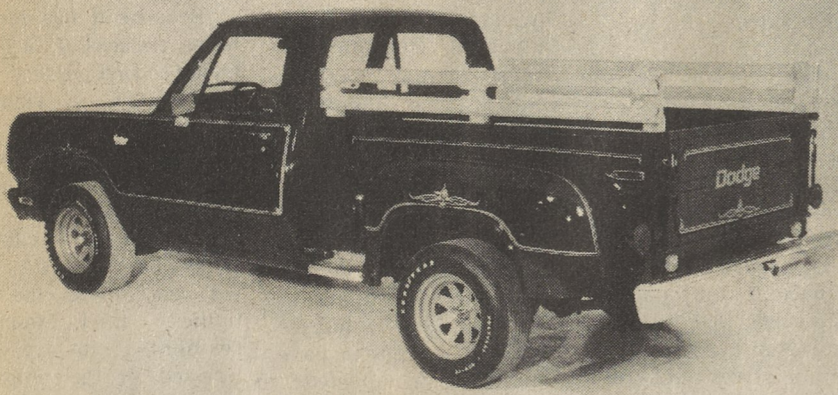
