NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Supervisors of Dallas Township at their regular meeting, to be held on Tuesday, the 4th of April, 1978, at seven-thirty P.M., will consider enacting the following Ordinance:

DALLAS TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 1978-1
RELATING TO ALARM SYSTEMS

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Supervisors of Dallas Township under the authority of Clauses XLII, XLVII, and LXII of Section 702 of the Second Class Township Code, that:

- SECTION 1.** Every person utilizing any direct communication, burglar, or fire alarm system connected with, or which when activated, would cause the telephone to be rung in, the police station of the Dallas Department of the Township of Dallas shall pay annually to the Township of Dallas for the benefits and advantages received, a license fee according to the following schedule:
- a. For banks, stores, and similar commercial establishments which have a direct line connected with the police station \$200.00
 - b. For banks, stores, and similar commercial establishments not utilizing a direct line \$100.00
 - c. For all other persons \$10.00

SECTION 2. Said license fee shall be payable annually during the month of January of each calendar year, or within 30 days after the installation of the alarm system. Any person who fails to pay such license fee shall have his alarm service with the Township suspended until such time as the license fee for the current year has been paid.

SECTION 3. Should any alarm system cause a false alarm to occur in the police station of the Township of Dallas, then a graduated service charge shall be levied against the owner of said system in accordance with the following schedule during each calendar year:

- 1 or 2 false alarms \$2 each
- 3 to 5 false alarms \$10 each
- 6 or more false alarms \$25 each and possible discontinuance of service.

SECTION 4. A false alarm will be excused under the following circumstances:

- a. If the alarm has been caused by an Act of God such as windstorms, thunder and lightning.
- b. If the alarm is followed within three minutes by a call to the Police Department with the proper coded identification concerning the alarm.
- c. If the alarm has been caused by the failure of equipment not located on the premises from which the alarm seems to have been activated.

SECTION 5. No alarm system which operates by causing the telephone to be rung in the police station shall be installed unless such alarm system includes an automatic disconnecting device which would be effective within three minutes after the call has been made.

SECTION 6. The Township of Dallas and its Police Department shall have the right to inspect at reasonable times the connection, operation, and maintenance of any alarm system connected with, or which, when activated, would cause the telephone to be rung in, the police station of the Police Department of Dallas.

SECTION 7. The installation of alarm system without a license and without the payment of a license fee under this ordinance and any other violation of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$100 and not more than \$300, to be collected by a Summary Proceeding to be brought by Dallas Township before any Magistrate.

SECTION 8. In this ordinance the word "person" shall be deemed to include any individual, establishment, partnership, corporation, or other organization utilizing any alarm system in all cases, the owner of the premises in which the alarm system is installed shall be responsible for the payment of license fees and other charges as set forth in this ordinance.

SECTION 9. This ordinance shall take effect on the first day of May, 1978, and license fees for the year 1978 will not be delinquent until after the 31st day of May, 1978.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF HARVEYS LAKE, LUZERNE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, ESTABLISHING A PLANNING COMMISSION UNDER THE PENNSYLVANIA MUNICIPALITIES PLANNING CODE.

BE IT ENACTED by the Council of the Borough of Harveys Lake as follows:

SECTION 1. COMMISSION ESTABLISHED
Under the provisions of the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code (Act of July 31, 1968, P.L. 805, 53 P.S. 10101, et seq.), there is hereby established the Harveys Lake Planning Commission, hereinafter referred to as the "Commission".

SECTION 2 COMPOSITION.
The Commission shall be composed of seven (7) members, who shall be appointed by the Borough Council, subject to the following qualifications:

- (A) All members of the Commission shall be a resident of the Borough of Harveys Lake.
- (B) At least five (5) members of the Commission designated as citizen members shall not be officers or employees of the Borough of Harveys Lake.

SECTION 3 INELIGIBILITY.
Failure to maintain a residence in the Borough of Harveys Lake, shall render a member of such Commission ineligible to continue his membership therein.

SECTION 4 TERMS OF OFFICE.
(A) The initial members of the Commission shall serve the following terms: The first and second named members shall serve for a term of four (4) years; the third and fourth named members shall serve for a term of three (3) years; and fifth and sixth named members shall serve for a term of two (2) years and the seventh named member shall serve for a term of one (1) year, or in each case, until their respective successors have been appointed and qualified.

(B) All subsequently appointed members to said Commission, shall serve for terms of four (4) years, or until their successors are appointed and qualified.

SECTION 5 COMPENSATION
All members of the Commission shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for necessary and reasonable expenses incurred in carrying out their Commission duties.

SECTION 6 ADMINISTRATIVE AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE
The Commission may, with the consent of the Borough Council and Borough Officers employ and utilize such other services as may be necessary, and utilize Borough Officers, and employees in carrying out their powers and duties.

SECTION 7 RECEIPT AND EXPENDITURES OF MONIES.
In carrying out their powers and duties, the Commission may receive and expend any gifts, grants, appropriations of money from any source, including Federal, Commonwealth or Local Funds, and may contract with governmental or private agencies or individuals with respect thereto; provided such funds are appropriated for use of the Commission by the Agency Controlling such Funds.

SECTION 8 POWERS AND DUTIES
(1) The Commission shall maintain and keep on file records of its action.
(B) The Commission shall make an Annual Report to the Borough Council of its activities and such other interim reports as may be requested of it by the Borough Council.
(C) The Commission is empowered to administer the Harveys Lake Subdivision Ordinance.
(D) The Commission shall make such recommendations and perform such activities as is requested by the Borough Council, consistent with the Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code.

SECTION 9 ABOLITION OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION.
Upon the organization of the Planning Commission, created by this Ordinance, the Planning Committee established by prior legislation is abolished. All power and duties previously vested in the Planning Committee is hereby vested in the Commission created by this Ordinance.

SECTION 10 SEVERABILITY
Should any portion or provision whatsoever of this Ordinance be determined to be invalid or unenforceable by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed severable but only to the extent of such holding shall not affect the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 11 REPEALER
All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 12 EFFECTIVE DATE
This Ordinance shall take effect immediately.
