

# Club cops 13 county honors

Dallas Junior Women's Club came home with 13 winners in the Luzerne County Federation of Women's Clubs Spring Festival of Arts held Monday at Gus Genetti's. With the exception of the crafts division, all first place winners will compete in the district contest. First place winners in the

district competition will advance to the state competition. State winners in the students' division will receive scholarship awards from the Pennsylvania Women's Clubs. Although the craft winners do not advance, each club may have a display of crafts at the district competition. The Dallas Club had two first

The Dallas Club also won first prize for its yearbook in Class A clubs with more than 100 members, and first prize for its yearbook which members designed and layed out but had printed professionally.

The Junior Women's Clubs in this district spent over 200,000 volunteer hours in the 1977-78 year and raised more than \$200,000 which is used for community service. The Luzerne County Clubs raised about half of that amount and spent about 100,000 hours.

Mrs. John Davis, Harveys Lake, president of the Luzerne County of Federated Women's Clubs, presided at the meeting.

There were six divisions in the art contest and the local club took four first places out of six.
