**CAC reviews grading system**

The Lake-Lehman Citizen's Advisory Council (CAC) held its monthly meeting on Monday, March 27, discussing new school district grading system.

James Nicholas, senior high school principal, spoke to the council regarding the newly implemented grading system in the secondary schools. Parental concern about the

new system had been previously voiced.

Nicholas indicated that the committee of teachers, pupils and administrators will review the grading system this spring. He expressed his concern over finding a grading system that is equitable and yet not defeat some students. The CAC suggested the possibility of investigating alternatives to grading.

A question arose as to the use of phonetics after second grade. It was suggested that the reading specialist be asked to come to the next CAC meeting to clarify the reading program.

The Volunteers in Action have decided to work on the Community Resource Bank to compile a file of community resource persons which could be

utilized by teachers to enrich classroom activities.

**Dallas students participate in Career Day**

Several students from the Dallas Senior High School were part of a special "Women In Engineering" symposium held recently during the 5th Annual Career Day at the Penn State Wilkes Barre Campus. Sponsored by the Luzerne County Chapter, Pa. Society of Professional Engineers, the all day program centered on the opportunities interested students will find in the engineering and science fields.

In addition to Professor Priscilla Allison of Penn States other panel members who answered questions from the prospective women engineers were Jean Hauck, office manager of an architectural firm, and Penn State bio-med instructor Cheryl Ebel. The

panel discussion ranged from debating the opportunities for women in specific fields and combining marriage and a career, to counseling students on an individual basis as to the exact courses of study available to them in college.

Several hundred students who attended the Career Day had the option of picking from other discussion groups which included: drafting, surveying, civil, architectural, electrical, mechanical, highway and chemical engineering; biology, chemistry, mathematics, computer science, physics, pre-med and dental, and nursing. The high school students also visited the extensive engineering and science labs at the Wilkes Barre

Campus and had the opportunity to speak with

both college instructors and professionals working in each field.

A reminder - If you have not registered your child for kindergarten, you are asked to please register him or her as soon as possible.

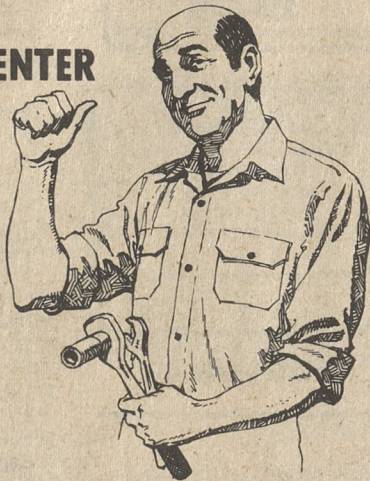

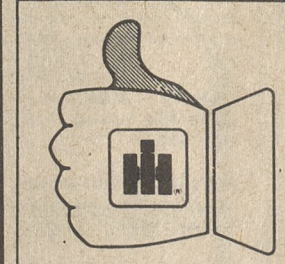
