

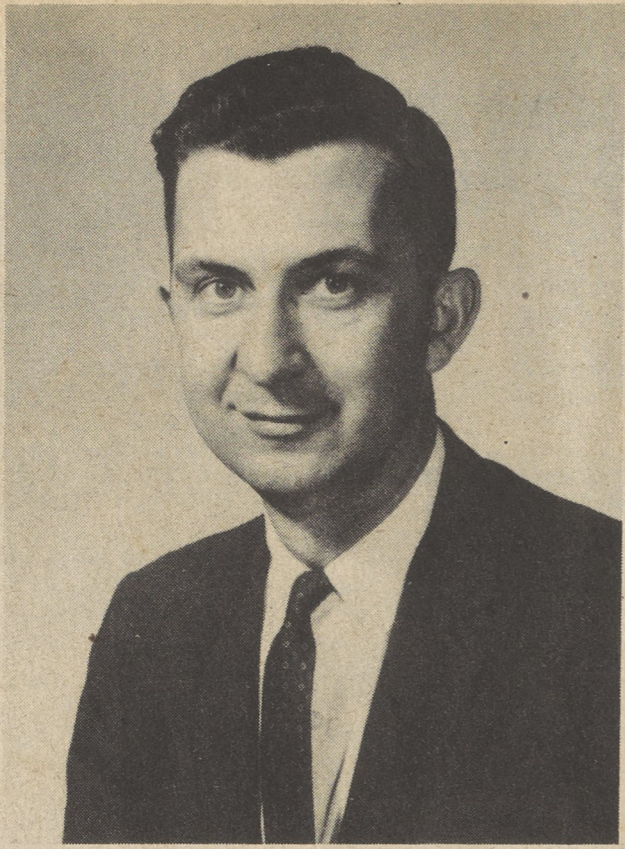
## Hoover speaker at Outlet

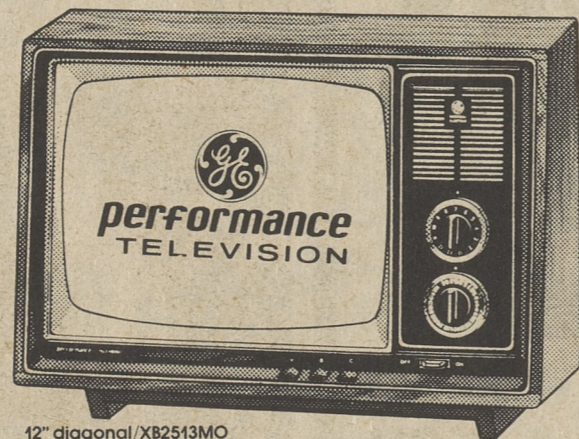
