

Motorists injured in Jackson Township

Two Wilkes-Barre motorists suffered injuries in separate accidents in Jackson Township last week, according to Township Chief of Police Don Jones.

Mark Fehrer, 530 North Washington St., Wilkes Barre, was taken to the Nesbitt Hospital in Kingston in the Jackson Township ambulance where he was given several sutures in his upper lip and released following an accident on Hillside Road late Monday afternoon, April 3.

Fehrer was reportedly driving a 1972 Chevrolet east on Hillside Road when he ran across an icy patch, lost control of his vehicle, and ran off the south berm, striking a utility pole. The car was towed from the scene. Investigating was Chief Jones.

Another Wilkes-Barre man, William Sutton of 344 North Main St., was admitted to Nanticoke State General Hospital Saturday evening with a face cut and complaints of neck or back pains after his car struck a garage and a stone wall along Route 29.

According to police, Sutton was driving a Buick sedan along Route 29 at about 7:45 p.m. when he lost control and crossed the highway, striking a garage and stone wall along the west berm on the property of Helen Bonning.

Damage to the Bonning property was estimated at approximately \$500. Sutton's car was towed from the scene, and he was taken to Nanticoke State in the Lake Silkworth ambulance. Investigating was Patrolman Andrew Kasko.

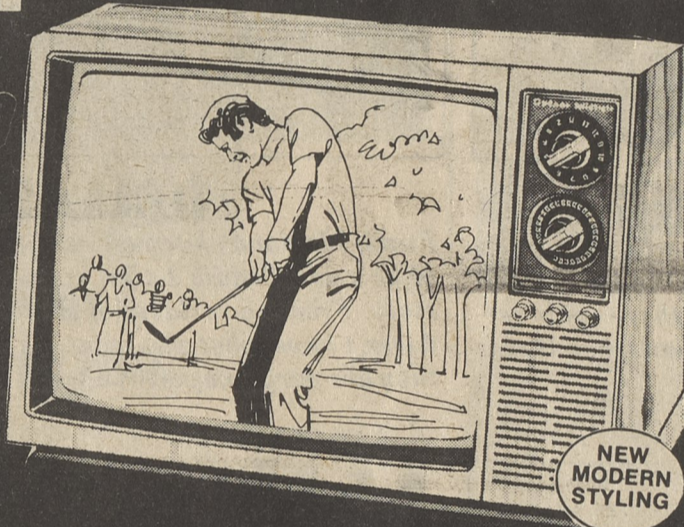

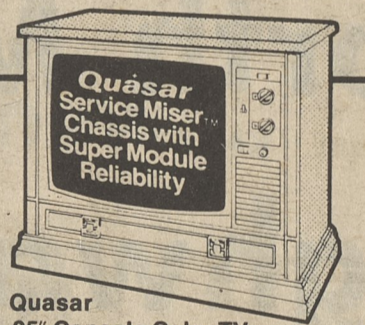

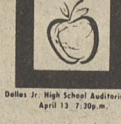
