Lehman Twp. to form new planning commission

Lehman Township supervisors adopted an ordinance to create a municipal planning

commission consisting of three persons at Monday night's meeting. According to solicitor William Valentine, a

recent municipal code requires a second class township to restructure the planning commission to

have not less than three members and not more than nine members. One member of the zoning hearing board must serve on the planning commission.

William Samuel, Jack Williams, and Harold Cornell were appointed to the municipal planning commission. Williams will serve on the zoning hearing board with Bill McCarrol and Barry Edwards. Although Samuel will serve as secretary for both groups, he will only have a vote on the planning commission.

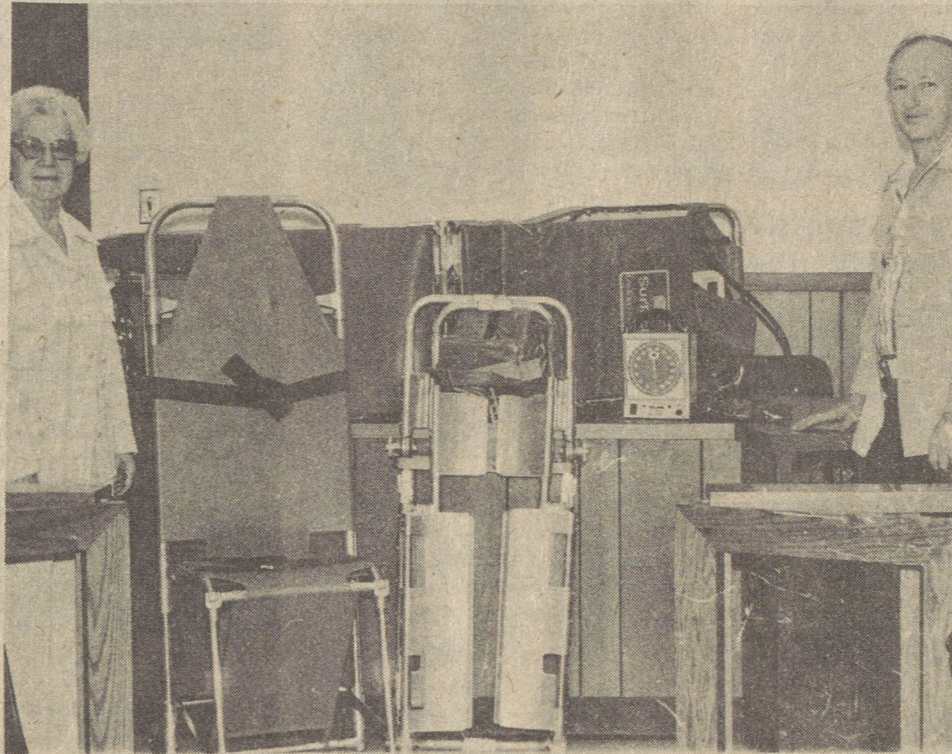
The board approved a motion to participate in obtaining a joint grant with five area municipalities for the purpose of obtaining radios for the township ambulance. Other municipalities participating in the program are Dallas Township, Kingston Township, Kunkle, and Northmoreland-Franklin.

In order to obtain the \$10,000 grant, which will be

divided among the townships, Lehman Township will serve as a central point through which the grant will be obtained. This will be done at no cost to the township.

The township's three fire companies were awarded a portion of their yearly allotment. Lake Silkworth Fire Company will receive \$500 since it has already been advanced \$1,000. Jonathan R. Davis Fire Company Idetown, and the Lehman Volunteer Fire Company will each receive \$1,500. Later this year each fire company will receive another \$500.

Several bids were accepted by the board. Contracts were awarded to Stewart I. Harris for a power shovel at \$5,500; Bradco Supply Company for calcium; either Addy Asphalt or American Asphalt will receive the contract for asphalt. The asphalt contract will be left to the discretion of the road foreman, Supervisor Allan Major.
