He said that meat prices have increased to a point where it is impractical financially to continue the offer. Steak has climbed to $\$ 3.49$ a pound and he had to increase the amount of tapes to $\$ 240$ for one pound. When it began, sirloin steak was 69 cents per pound, he said.
The largest amount of tapes handed in for credit was $\$ 7,000$ according to Ray. There were several two and four thousand dollar bundles of tapes which put steak on the menu. One woman submitted a bundle
