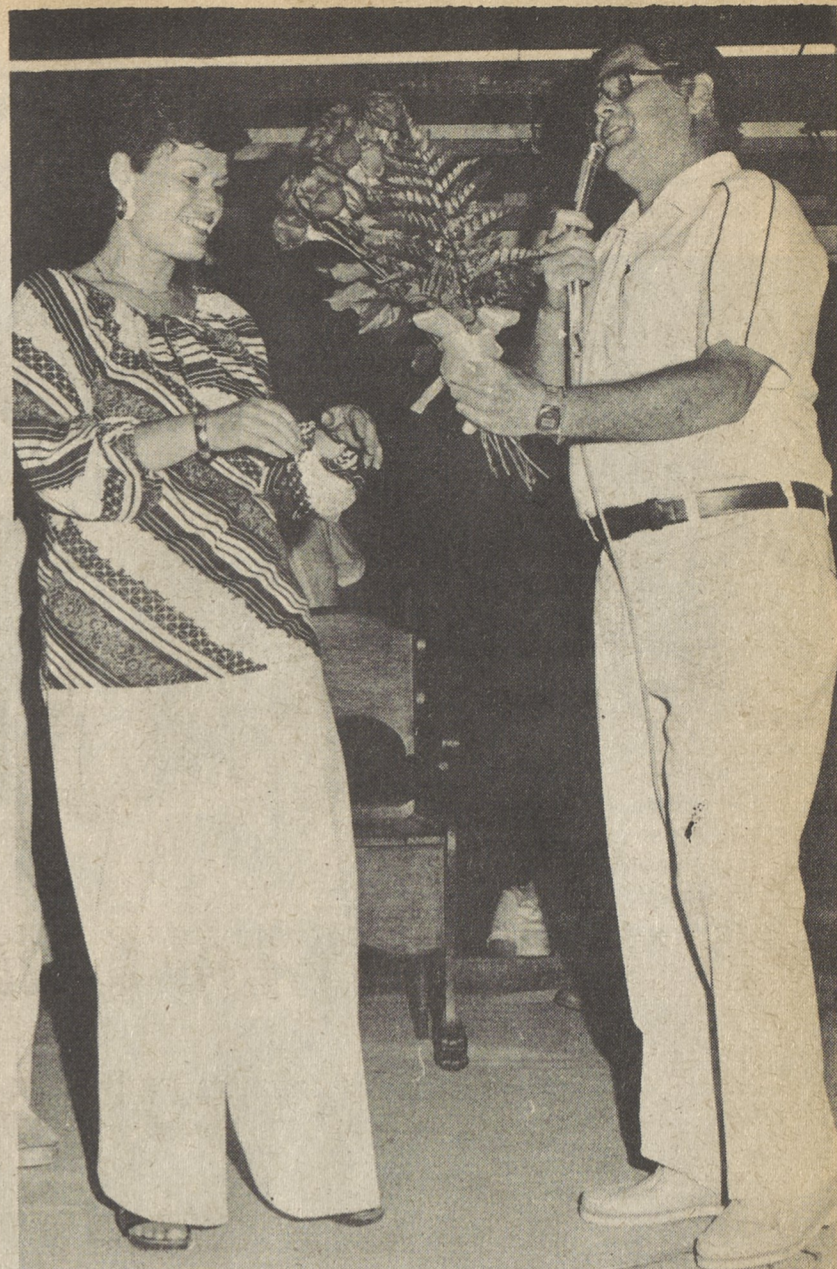

WHAT DO YOU DO-When you're the auctioneer and you want to bid on something, say Dr. Les Jordan



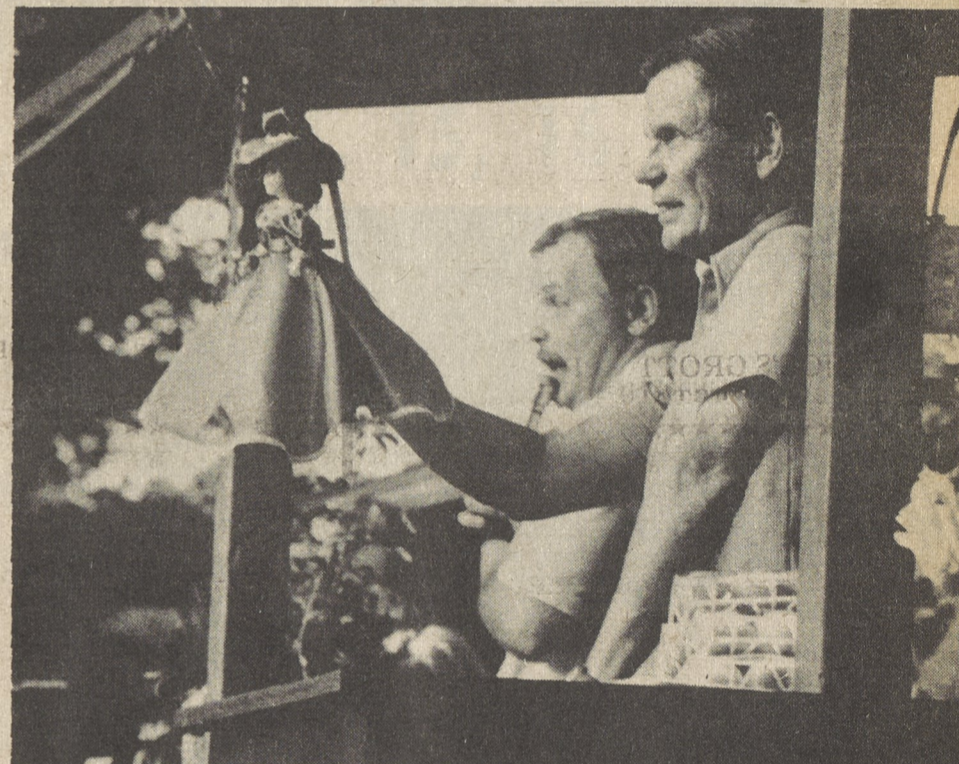
HAIRCUT AND SHAVE-No, just trying out my new barber chair, Monty Evans tells Clarke Bittner.

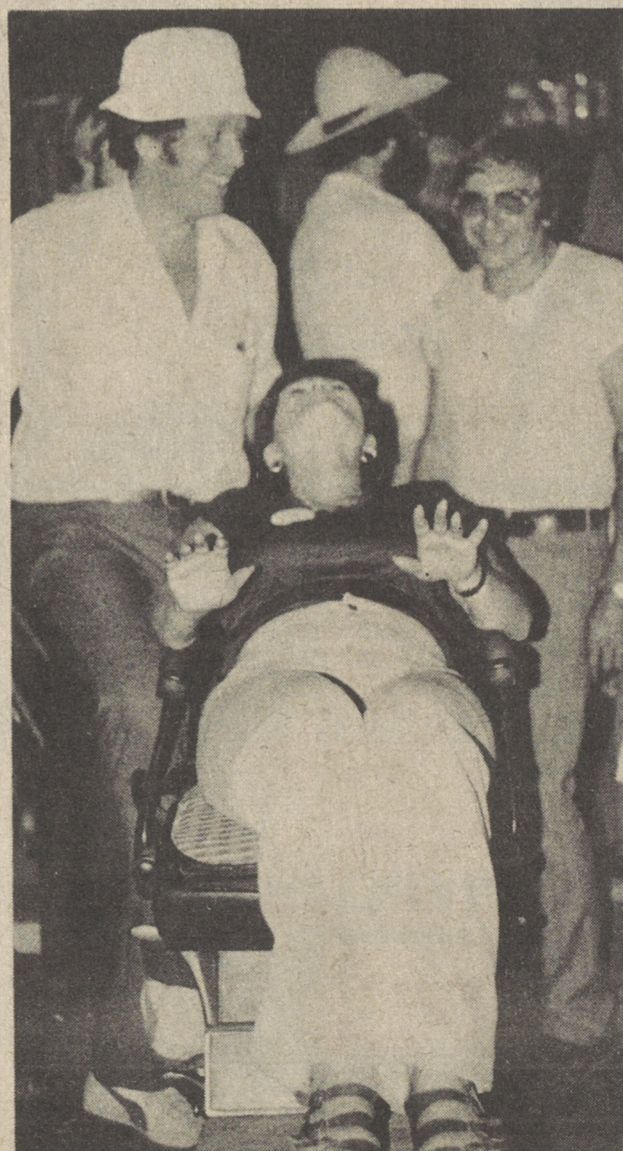
WHAT DO YOU DO-You let your daughter do the bidding just as Jeris Jones did and bought the dental cabinet.
