Worden's remaining schedule includes participation in training exercises with other Seventh Fleet units and those of allied nations.

Worden is 533 feet long, displaces 7,800 tons and carries a crew of 396 officers and enlisted men. She is outfitted with guns, missile launchers, torpedo tubes and an anti-submarine rocket launcher.

## Ide family to observe diamond jubilee

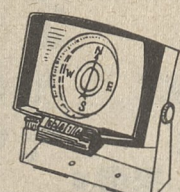
