NOTICE
On Thursday, September 7, 1978, at 8:00 o'clock P.M., at the Daniel C. Roberts Fire Company Building, Harveys Lake Borough, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania, the Council of the Borough of Harveys Lake will consider for passage the following Ordinance entitled:

SECTION 10: REDUCTION OR ELIMINATION OF MEMBER CONTRIBUTIONS, providing for the reduction or elimination of member contributions where such reduction or elimination will not adversely affect the actuarial soundness of the Fund.

SECTION 11: GIFTS, authorizes the Borough of Harveys Lake to take by gift, property for the benefit of the Fund.

SECTION 12: PENSION BENEFITS NOT SUBJECT TO LEGAL PROCESS GENERALLY, provides as stated in this subtitle.

SECTION 13: EXPENSES OF ADMINISTRATION, provides that the Borough of Harveys Lake shall appropriate sufficient funds to administer this Pension Plan.

SECTION 14: ELECTION TO JOIN PENNSYLVANIA MUNICIPAL RETIREMENT SYSTEM UNDER ARTICLE IV OF THE PENNSYLVANIA MUNICIPAL RETIREMENT LAW

In addition to the items specified in the title, the aforesaid Ordinance generally provides as follows:

SECTION 1: ESTABLISHMENT OF PLAN, providing that the Fund shall be under the direction of the Borough of Harveys Lake.

SECTION 2: ELIGIBILITY FOR PARTICIPATION IN PROGRAM, providing that each full time Policeman shall be eligible to participate in the Police Pension Plan.

SECTION 3: AGE AND SERVICE REQUIREMENTS, providing that each participant who has been a Harveys Lake Police Officer for Twenty-five (25) years in the aggregate, and has attained the age of fifty-five (55) years may retire and shall be entitled to the benefits thereunder.

SECTION 4: MILITARY LEAVE CREDIT, providing that a member of the Police Force may credit time spent in the Force under certain conditions.

SECTION 5: CONTRIBUTION RATE, providing that members shall pay an amount equal to five (5) percent of their compensation to the Fund.

SECTION 6: RETIREMENT OR PENSION BENEFITS, setting forth the amount of the monthly pension benefits to which the aforesaid Police Officer may be entitled.

SECTION 7: DISABILITY BENEFITS, providing for certain benefits upon the disability of a member of the Pension Plan and further defining certain terms and setting up certain qualifications.

SECTION 8: RETURN OF MEMBER CONTRIBUTIONS WITH INTEREST, providing for the refund of monies paid into the Fund upon being declared ineligible to receive a pension.

SECTION 9: ALLOCATION OF COMMONWEALTH FUNDS, providing for the order in which funds paid from the State Treasurer shall be applied.

SECTION 15: CREDIT FOR PRIOR SERVICE, provides that the Borough of Harveys Lake shall assume the liability for payment of one hundred (100) percent of the original member's contribution for prior service to the municipality.

SECTION 16: FILING, provides that a certified copy of this Ordinance shall be filed with the Pennsylvania Municipal Retirement Board and the membership shall be effective sixty (60) days after enactment of this Ordinance.

SECTION 17: INDEMNIFICATION, provides that the Borough of Harveys Lake agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Pennsylvania Municipal Retirement Board from all causes of action brought by or on behalf of any Policeman, whose pension rights have vested under previous pension plans adopted by the Borough Council of Harveys Lake.
