

Bank offers HEAL program

First Eastern Bank has entered into a contract with the Department of Health, Education and Welfare to administe a new Health Education Assistance Loanj--"HEAL"-Program.

HEAL rovides federally insured loans to graduate students in a wide variety of health related fields and will become effective Sept. 15, according to Richard M. Ross, Jr., First Easterns president and chief executive officer. Robert W. Brown, vice

Robert W. Brown, vice president and installment loan coordinator, said the bank has allocated \$1-million for the first year of the program. He added that graduate students in approved schools of medicine, osteopathic medicine, dentistry,

veterinary medicine, optometry, podiatry, pharmacy and public health are eligible.

health are eligible.

According to HEW guidelines, health professions students may borrow up to \$10,000 a year to a total of \$50,000 through the HEAL Program, with the exception of pharmacy students, who may borrow up to \$7,500 a year to a total

of \$37,500.

In addition to tuition and fees, the loans may be used to pay reasonable personal expenses, transportation and commuting costs, and laboratory expenses.

During internship, residency, a nine-month grace period and authorized deferment periods, individuals may borrow to pay interest on prior HEAL loans.
