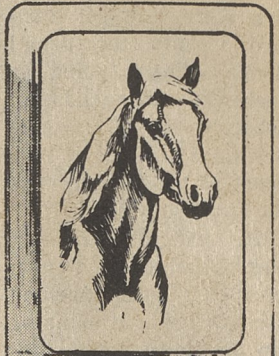

DALLAS BOROUGH ORDINANCE NO. 1978 -

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF DALLAS REGULATING THE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL OF GARBAGE AND OTHER TRASH IN THE BOROUGH OF DALLAS

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Dallas, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

1. In order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Dallas Borough, it shall be unlawful for any person for hire to haul, transport, collect, remove and dispose of garbage, refuse, rubbish or bulky wastes over the streets and alleys of the Borough of Dallas without first securing a license to do so.

2. The Borough of Dallas, upon application and after investigation as the Borough shall deem necessary, will issue a license to collect, transport and remove for hire garbage and other trash for a period of the calendar year. The fee for such license shall be One (\$1.00) Dollar per calendar year, or any part thereof. Any person desiring a license shall apply in writing to the Borough Secretary of the Borough of Dallas, who shall issue a license after appropriate investigation. If the Borough Secretary refuses to issue a license, the application shall be referred to the Borough Council for action.

3. All licensees under this Ordinance shall be required to dispose of garbage, refuse, rubbish or bulky wastes with the nearest sanitary landfill which has been approved by the Department of Environmental Resources of Pennsylvania.

4. Any license issued pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance shall be revocable by the Borough upon failure of the licensee to comply with any of the provisions of this Ordinance, or any regulation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Environmental Resources, relating to the collection and disposition of solid wastes.

5. Any person or entity violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be guilty of a summary offense and, upon conviction before any District Magistrate, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars for each offense.

Sections 13 and 16 of the Harveys Lake Borough ordinance known and cited as the "Cable Television Franchise Ordinance" are published this week due to typographical errors in Sections 13 and 16 as they appeared in the Sept. 28 issue of the Dallas Post.

SECTION 13. PROGRAMS AND SERVICE CONTENT

The Company shall within three (3) months after the latter of the date it accepts this Ordinance, or receives or has received a valid Certificate of Compliance from the Federal Communications Commission, if any is necessary, provide to all subscribers and users, four (4) channels and within nine (9) months, a total of twelve (12) channels, which shall include no more than two (2) educational channels, one (1) home box office channel, and one (1) time and weather channel, three (3) local channels and five (5) independent channels.

SECTION 16. ACCEPTANCE OF FRANCHISE

If the Company shall decide to exercise the rights and privileges set forth in this Ordinance, it shall file in writing its unequivocal acceptance of all of the terms and provisions hereof with the Borough within thirty (30) days of final enactment of this Ordinance. Such an acceptance shall constitute an agreement on the part of the Company to comply with all of the terms, conditions and provisions of this Ordinance.
