Two women injured in Dallas accident

Two Kingston women were treated at Nesbitt Hospital Friday for injuries suffered when the car in which they were

riding was struck from behind as it paused on Route 309 while awaiting the chance to make a left turn into the parking lot of

Arthur Treacher's in Dallas Borough. Treated were Esther Walter, 64, of 929, Market St., Kingston, and

Margaret Hoag, 74, same address. They were passengers in a 1973 Chevrolet driven by Jonah Smith, 65, RD 1, Dallas.

According to Dallas Borough Police, Smith was trying to make the left turn when he was struck from behind by a 1973 Buick driven by Betty J. Rusonis, 53, of RD 4, Dallas. Both vehicles were towed from the scene.

The two operators refused medical care at the scene. Investigating is Chief Edward Lyons.

Dallas Township arrests four

Dallas Township Police are looking for the last of four youths wanted in connection with the theft of a car from Kingston Borough last week.

Chief of Police Carl Miers of Dallas Township said that he received a call on Friday to go to the ball diamond area of Fernbrook where some juveniles were operating a car recklessly. The four fled on foot, with

three being later apprehended.

The four were reportedly escapees from St. Michael's School for Boys at Hoban Heights. Chief Miers said that the identity of the fourth boy is known. Two of the boys were from Dallas Township and two from Kingston Borough. They are being petitioned to Luzerne County Juvenile Court.

Dallas youth treated

A Dallas boy was treated Saturday at Nesbitt Hospital, Kingston, for injuries suffered when he was struck by an automobile while he was trying to move through traffic on a motorized pedalcycle.

Treated was Matthew Krivak, 13, of RD 6, Poplar

St., Dallas. According to Dallas Borough Police, Krivak was riding his vehicle south on the berm of 309 when he turned onto the roadway into slowly moving traffic and was struck by a 1975 Pontiac driven by Robert A. Daley, 19, of 19 Pellam St., Dallas.

The Daley vehicle was traveling north.

The car struck Krivak and carried him for approximately 30 feet before he fell off and landed in the southbound lane. Daley's windshield was damaged. Investigating is Ptlm. John Fowler.

Bridget McGuire injured

A Dallas girl was injured Friday in a collision on Route 309, Kingston Township.

Suffering a knee injury was Bridget McGuire, 17, of 324 Center Hill Rd. She was treated at Nesbitt Hospital, Kingston. Her sister, Mary, 15, a passenger in the McGuire car, was examined at the hospital and released.

The McGuire car collided with another driven by Sandra Walp, 20, of Box 71, Wapwallopen, RD 1. McGuire was traveling north on 309 while Walp was turning east on Center Hill Rd.

Hearing scheduled

Two Back Mountain men are scheduled for a preliminary hearing on charges of criminal trespass Thursday, Oct. 19, before District Magistrate Earl Gregory, Shavertown. Free in the meantime on \$300 bail apiece are Terry Lee Campbell of 165 Valley View Park, RD 3, Dallas, and Daniel A. Coolbaugh, Pole 213, Harveys Lake.

The two men were arraigned before Gregory by Kingston Township Chief of Police Paul Sabol Tuesday and released on their own recognizance. They are accused of having entered the premises of Philip Taylor, 57 Carverton Road, and removed "ladder jacks and plant" after having been warned not to enter.

The hearing is set for 2 p.m. on the 19th.

The entire exercise emphasizes the orderly disposition of forces and stressed deployment procedures and techniques.
