Suzanne David, Miss Donna Ide, Mrs. Joyce Gepfert and Miss Lois Gepfert.

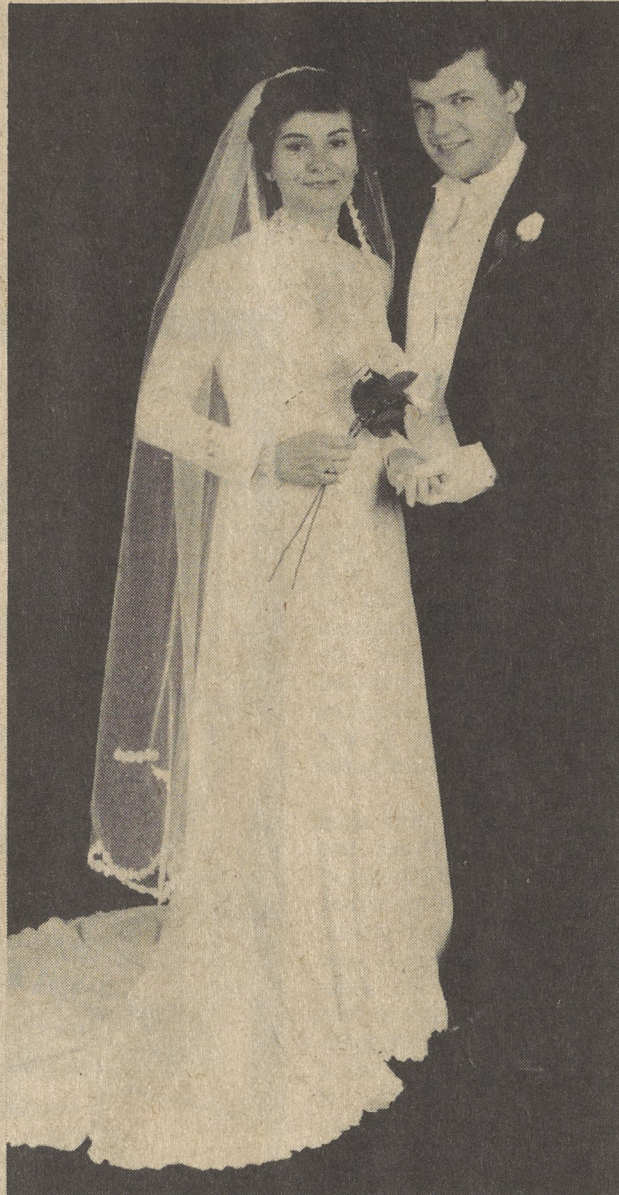
Kent Feagler, brother of the bridegroom, was best man. The ushers were Rex Gepfert, Robert McMichael, Herbert David and Steven McMichael.
