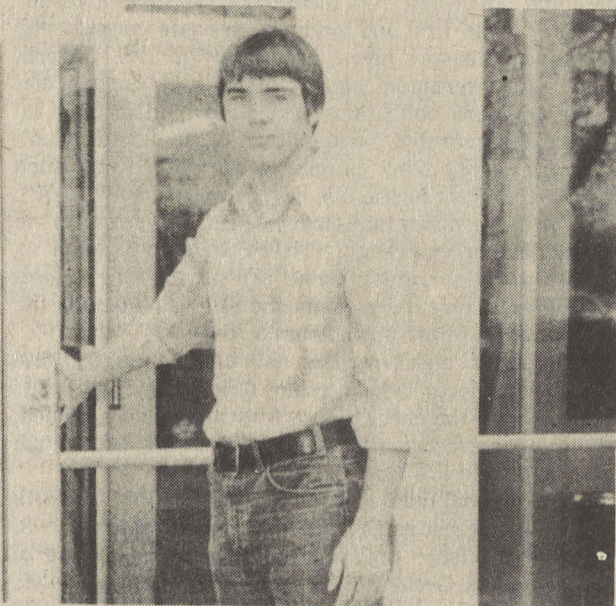

Lisa McCartney

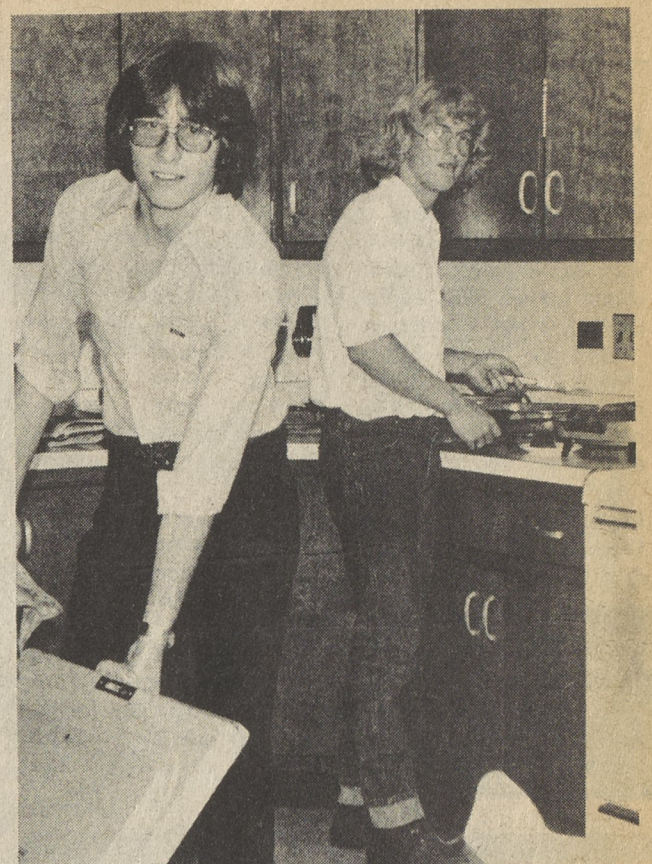
In the Spotlight at Dallas Senior High School this week is Lisa McCartney, a senior in the academic department.
